b) An e-learning module on the importance of child participation is developed or alternatively a conference is held for staff to attend to ensure that all relevant Council staff understand the importance of child participation. Any changes to be made. The first planning meeting was held on 27.11.18 with 7 Children in Care Council members. They are going to plan, organise and run the conference. The provisional date is Feb 15th but we are waiting for confirmation from our guest speakers. The date will be confirmed for the next meeting.
c) Young people should be involved in the recruitment process of staff who will be working with children and young people. This will ensure that the views of young people are taken into account on what qualities and skills they feel individuals should possess.	Develop a Young Recruiter Panel. The Panel will support the appointment of Senior Leaders in Children's Service. HR are reviewing Recruitment policies and are going to provide training to the Young People. An action plan will be developed along with a job description for young people.	 28/11/18 - We currently have had young people's involvement in the Virtual Schools interviews, Heads of Service interviews as and when they are required and the young ambassador's position. HR have recently reviewed the recruitment and selection policy and have written a step within that which includes the involvement of young people in recruitment sorry didn't get back to you but this was done within timescale The participation officer is working with Jane Wilson and Sharon Holland from HR to pull together a Young Recruiters panel. This will involve a panel of young people to be trained on the interview process and supported to feel confident to be involved

		in interviews. We will have a pool of young people to call on and their voice and influence will be embedded within the entire recruitment process.
d) The number of forums in Middlesbrough for children/young people who are not currently engaged in statutory services to express their views is limited. The Panel recommends that an annual conference is held for all youth groups to come together to discuss current issues and express their views.	The Participation officer has created a leaflet advertising yourvoiceyourmiddlesrough@middlesbrough.gov' for children and young people, parents and carers to sign up to be involved in decisions about Middlesbrough. This leaflet has been distributed to over 200 families at the FEELGOODBORO event & has been added to the local offer.	 28/11/2018 – The participation officer is developing a 'Have your say' council for looked after children ages 7-13 years old. This group will work with the Children in Care Council. An annual consultation pack is currently being created working in partnership with Beverly school. This will be made up of a number of topics such as transitions, work readiness, safe in the community, preparing for adulthood and leisure and activities. This will be offered to all schools and will provide SENCO's with termly consultation sessions and a clear feedback loop to the relevant teams. We will be able to evidence the work that teams are doing following the feedback from young people. To pilot with Beverly School in January for feedback and comments. A parent consultation e-mail group has been created and has 80 members signed up. The consultation plan will be the same as the SENCO pack so that parents, carers, children and young people are consulting about the same topics in order to get the full picture. This is also in partnership with Beverly School.

e)	The Panel recommends that the Member of Youth Parliament is supported to develop a Youth Council. All schools and academies should be invited to become active members on the Youth Council. The Panel also strongly agreed that once the Youth Council is established it should be provided with its own budget to be used to support campaigns, training, activities and participation and is to be used at the sole discretion of the Youth Council. The Panel also recommended that the Voice of the Child Participation Coordinator be awarded a budget to support the work around child participation.	The Participation officer is working with the Democratic officer, the MYP and the Head of British Youth Council to pull together a structured action plan to take forward a recruitment campaign within schools and youth settings. The Participation officer is scheduled to attend the next Head teachers briefing to promote the plans for the Youth Council.	 28/11/2018 - Due to school commitments now as Ben has got his GCSE's, Ben Carr has had to step down as the Middlesbrough MYP. A rep from the Children in Care Council and the participation officer attended the House of Commons trip with the BYC on Ben's behalf. A young man has expressed his interest in becoming a rep for Middlesbrough Youth Council. The participation officer and the Democratic services officer are going to meet with him to discuss his involvement in December.
f)	Once a Youth Council is established, its Chair or Vice Chair should be invited to attend Full Council. The Panel recommended that the Youth Council have a standing item on its agenda to provide updates on its work that can be fed back to Middlesbrough Council.
