## **Corporate Parenting**

- Central Government
- Local Authorities
- Children's Trust Partners
- Individual professionals and carers

Responsible for ensuring the best for children and young people in care – as they would for their own children.



## **Lead Responsibility**

#### Director of Children's Services and Lead Member

- Children & young people in care participate equally in positive activities along with their peers
- Set out a 'Pledge' to children in care saying what services and support children in care should expect to receive.



### A Good Start.....

 Arrange appropriate, high quality, early years provision for children in care under five.

 Play strategies should address the play requirements of children in care.



### At School.....

- Guidance for schools promote and support take of extended schools activities by children and young people in care
- Give schools funding provide 2 hours a week of extended school group activity & 2 weeks of holiday provision free of charge
- New regulations ensure children in care get music tuition in schools free of charge



## **Sport & Leisure**

- Education and Inspections Act 2006 duty to provide positive leisure time activities
- Local authorities make their own leisure provision free for children and young people in care. (This is consistent with the role of the corporate parent.)
- Youth Sport Trust and Sport England new approaches to community-based sport for children in care



## **Youth Service Support**

- Priority status in local authority youth work provision
- Improve outcomes through involvement in youth work activity
- Engagement with the Youth Opportunity Fund
- Aiming High for Young People national minimum standards



## In the Care System

- Leisure activities a key part of the care planning process
- Social Workers to ensure good support is available
- Foster carer training to cover play and leisure time activities
- Information packs for carers and children
- Social pedagogy in residential care



## In the Care System continued

- Ensure that all children in care who need and want them have access to independent visitors.
- Provide £500 a year to support educational and developmental needs.
