WHAT MAKES THE DIFFERENCE PEER RESEARCH FINDINGS

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PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

1. The purpose of this report is to present the Corporate Parenting Board with the feedback that the Pathway Team received on its contribution to the 'What Makes the Difference' (WMTD) Peer Research Project (Appendix 1), a summary of the findings of the peer research (Appendix 2) and to show the Board the associated DVD.

BACKGROUND

- 2. The 'What Makes the Difference' (WMTD) Project ended in March 2008. The project worked across four themes Preparation and Planning, Empowerment, Education, and Training and Employment Opportunity. The overall aim of the project was to ask 250 young people from across the country, "What made the difference?" and "What could have made the difference?" for them while they were in, and leaving, care.
- 3. Care experienced young people were trained to carry out research interviews with young people to ascertain their views, opinions and experiences. This information has been used to develop a range of resources to support local authorities in their work with young people in, and leaving, care. Two young people from Middlesbrough were among the 33 people from 25 local authorities who were trained to carry out the research. With support from the Pathway Team, they carried out a total of 16 interviews with young people from Middlesbrough.
