126	Councillor Walters	Councillor N Walker	<p>“Middlesbrough Council notes that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • National Joint Council (NJC) basic pay has fallen by 21% since 2010 in real terms • NJC workers had a three-year pay freeze from 2010-2012 • Local terms and conditions of many NJC employees have also been cut, impacting on their overall earnings • NJC pay is the lowest in the public sector • Job evaluated pay structures are being squeezed and distorted by bottom-loaded NJC pay settlements needed to reflect the increased National Living Wage and the Foundation Living Wage • There are growing equal and fair pay risks resulting from this situation <p>This Council therefore supports the NJC pay claim for 2018, submitted by UNISON, GMB and UNITE on behalf of council and school workers subject to the additional costs being provided for in future Local Government and associated funding settlements. This Council also calls on the LGA to make urgent representations to Government to fund the NJC claim and pay spine review and notify us of their action in this regard.”</p>
