It has been demonstrated through the 2010/11 LDF Annual Monitoring Report that Middlesbrough does not have a five-year supply. The review will be carried out in line with the Town and Country Planning Regulations and also the Council's adopted Statement of Community Involvement. Differences from any previous approach **Description:** This review is focused on just the housing elements of the Local Plan / LDF Core Strategy and Regeneration DPD whereas when the documents were originally prepared they looked a wider issues such as employment and the town centre and retail. It is not thought necessary to review these other elements at this time. • Kev stakeholders and intended beneficiaries (internal and external as appropriate) Widespread consultation has been undertaken with the public, statutory consultees, businesses, developers and other stakeholders in line with the Council's adopted Statement of Community Involvement. Intended outcomes. • The intended outcome is to establish Middlesbrough's housing requirements and identify sufficient deliverable housing sites to meet these needs. The Local Plan – Housing Main Modifications will be submitted to the Planning Inspector holding the Local Plan Public Examination Live date: on July 4th 2014. The final documents are not expected to be adopted Autumn 2014.
