Analysis

The three locations identified by stakeholders as part of the consultation all have merit as sites for the proposed new community facility. In weighing up the potential merits and disadvantages of each site we have considered a wide range of factors; Availability and Access, Public Perception and Added Value. In considering the relative ability of each site to

deliver against each of these it is clear the Southlands site provides the most comprehensive case as a location. In all three elements it contributes positively, whilst with the two other sites do not meet the same standards in relation to each.
