b) In terms of the operation of the foodbank, the Panel is aware that this will depend on the goodwill of volunteers. It is therefore recommended that agreement be sought for Middlesbrough Council staff, where appropriate, to be granted paid time off to volunteer in the Foodbank. Appropriate training from the Trussel Trust would be provided for this.	The two busiest foodbanks are North Ormesby and Clifton St (near Tesco on Linthorpe Rd). Clifton St offers a town centre location and they offer free bus vouchers for clients if they live a bus ride away. Although longer term the Trussel Trust would not rule out opening anther one in the town centre, demand is currently being met by the 8 Foodbanks already in operation. The project team will continue to engage with the Trussel Trust to monitor demand. The Trussel Trust currently operates with 2 part-time staff plus volunteers. At present they are adequately staffed but would welcome additional support from Council staff as volunteers/work shadowing to increase awareness.
