The purpose of the report was to seek approval for the publication of the Regeneration Development Plan Document (DPD). The content of the report was considered and approved.

Mayor to address the Board	 The Mayor conveyed the aims and objectives, which will help in: Promoting Middlesbrough locally, regionally and nationally and; Ensuring that strategically, all Council services are delivered effectively and efficiently. The remaining Executive Members have been scheduled to attend OSB over the course of the municipal year.
Diversity and Equality Policy 2007-2010	A report was presented to the Board containing information on the Diversity and Equality Policy. The Policy is for the benefit of all Members,

employees and service users of the Council and aims to ensure that: no employee, job applicant or service user receives less favourable treatment because of their gender, race, disability, religion or belief, sexual orientation or age as defined in the relevant anti-discrimination legislation services meet the needs of our diverse communities, especially those who experience discrimination and disadvantage policies and procedures promote and monitor diversity in Council employment and deal effectively with discrimination and harassment any barriers that discourage access to employment or services are minimised or removed. The Board approved the content of the report and requested that all Members be encouraged to attend the forthcoming training events on this important policy. **Early Years Learning** The Board considered the Children and Learning Scrutiny Panel's final Outcomes and Sure report on this topic. Start - Final Report of the Children & OSB heard that early childhood is crucial in terms of children's **Learning Scrutiny** development and well-being. Growth is rapid and a significantly high Panel proportion of learning takes place from birth to six years old. It is therefore a time when children particularly need high quality learning and development experiences. Given the importance of early years development, the scrutiny panel sought to investigate service provision in Middlesbrough, with a particular emphasis on learning outcomes and the role of Sure Start. The report and its recommendations were approved and will be referred to the Executive. **AGENDA ITEM TITLE ACTION/COMMENTARY** The Developing Role The overall aim of the Scrutiny investigation was to undertake a review of of the Street Wardens the developing role of the street warden service following the recent Final Report of the change in management arrangements. Social Care & Adult **Services Report** The panel was interested to find out how the role of the wardens had developed since the scheme was introduced. Members were concerned that there was a perception that the wardens' role had become to wide and therefore too onerous for the wardens to be able to deliver. The panel also took into consideration that there was an apparent public perception that the wardens were a 'back up' service to support the police. Following the shift to a more community development focussed service

the panel wanted to consider if this was an appropriate role for the wardens. If it was, the panel then wanted to establish if the wardens

Teenagers Hanging Around – Final Report of the Community Safety & Leisure Scrutiny Panel Consideration of Requests for Scrutiny Reviews: Play Scheme Provision	were equipped for the new role and consider whether there was the appropriate training and support available to wardens. The Board considered and approved the content of the report .The report will now be submitted to the Executive Office to await the service's response. The aims of the scrutiny investigation were to: Explore and identify the key issues associated with teenagers hanging around, which the Auditors considered significant in bringing this subject to Members attention. What are the links between residents feeling less well informed about the Councils actions and teenagers hanging around and what is being undertaken to address this. Are there any direct links between teenagers hanging around and anti social behaviour or is it primarily one of perception. What is the Council or Middlesbrough Partnership doing to address this concern in either marketing or driving activities to attract teenagers away from hanging around The report was approved subject to deleting recommendation 'D' and will now be referred to the Executive. A report was presented to the Board requesting Members to consider the appropriateness of commissioning a scrutiny review into play scheme provision within Middlesbrough. It was agreed that the request would be added to the work programme containing possible reviews, for the next municipal year, and will be considered at a later date.
