Audit Commission - Audit and Inspection Letter-March 2008	The report provided an overall summary of the Audit Commission's assessment of the Council. Information was provided on the most recent Comprehensive Performance Assesment (CPA), the findings and conclusions from the audit of the Council for 2006/07 and from inspections undertaken since the last Annual Audit and Inspection Letter.  The Board noted the content of the document.
Erimus Housing - Grounds Maintenance Contract	The Environment Scrutiny Panel sought to investigate the circumstances surrounding the Council losing the Erimus Housing - Grounds Maintenance Contract, which was valued at over £900,000. Given that the authority will still be responsible for grounds maintenance of some areas of Erimus Housing's estates, the implications for service provision were also considered.  An update was provided at the OSB meeting following the Environment Scrutiny Panel's consideration of the report at its 28 April 2008 meeting.  The report and its recommendations were approved and will be referred to the Executive.
Speed Cameras – Final Report of the Community Safety and Leisure Scrutiny Panel	The overall aim of the Scrutiny investigation was to assess the issues associated with speed cameras and make appropriate recommendations which would address concerns outlined in the terms of reference. The report and its recommendations were approved and will be referred to the Executive.

Major Adaptations - Final Report of the Social Care and Adult Services Scrutiny Panel	The overall aim of the Scrutiny investigation was to consider the length of time people have to wait for the provision of major adaptations to their home, whether the wait is acceptable and if not, consider how waiting times can be improved.  The report and its recommendations were approved and will be referred to the Executive
New Approaches to the Operation of the Scrutiny Function	The purpose of the report was to present the results of the recent review of the scrutiny function.  A thorough review of the scrutiny process has been undertaken which has involved discussions with non-executive members and the scrutiny team. Non-executive members were given the opportunity to air their views and comments at a meeting with the Chair of the Overview and Scrutiny Board and their comments have been collated and used to develop the suggestions.  The Board supported the new ways of working, which will be introduced during the 2008/09 municipal year. Changes will include:  New ways of gathering evidence Improved written information for panels Using pre-meetings to ensure meetings operate more effectively Undertaking shorter reviews (in some cases) Better use of the forward work programme Improved involvement of scrutiny in considering policy framework documents  A copy of the OSB's report is attached at Appendix 1 for Members' information.
