SCRUTINY REVIEW - IMPLEMENTATION OF RECOMMENDATIONS

PURPOSE OF REPORT

1. To inform the Panel of the progress achieved with the implementation of agreed Executive actions resulting from the consideration of scrutiny reports.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2. The electronic Scrutiny Monitoring Database was introduced in June 2003, to enable Members to track the implementation of agreed Executive Action Plans. The database is accessible through the lotus notes system.
- 3. As agreed by the OSB, the scrutiny panels will receive quarterly updates on the progress of scrutiny recommendations and in particular the actions that have not been successfully implemented.
- 4. Provided within Appendix A is a position update for the following reports:-
- Respite and Palliative Care Services for Children with Life Limiting Illnesses
- Choose and Book
- Life Expectancy with a Particular Focus on Cardiovascular Disease
- Audiology Services
- Patient Transport To and From James Cook University Hospital
- 5. Since the implementation of the monitoring system, the Health Scrutiny Panel has produced a total of **97** recommendations, of which **78** should have been implemented by **February 2009**.
- 6. To summarise, of the 78 Executive actions which should have been implemented by February 2009:-

- 7. All of the agreed Executive actions for the following reviews have been completed:
- (July 03) Review of District General Hospital Services
- (Sept 03) Review of Patient & Public Involvement

- (Mar 04) Appropriate Hospital Care for Older People
- (May 04) Dental Health
- (May 05) Healthy Living Review
- (Sept 05) Emergency Admissions into James Cook University Hospital
- (May 06) Tobacco Control within Enclosed Public Places
- (Aug 06) Out of Hours Services
- (June 07) Healthcare Associated Infections

These reports have now been archived within the database.

RECOMMENDATION

- 8. In an attempt to maintain 'continuous feedback' Members may wish to revisit topics to monitor the progress being made. Members may request that evidence of impact and results should be presented to the scrutiny panel.
- 9. As part of the scrutiny evaluation process, Members may consider inviting back individuals or groups that have previously given evidence to inform a scrutiny review or inquiry to discuss whether there has been any discernible change in the service provided since the recommendations were approved and implemented.
