Purpose of Investigation:

To investigate the implications of the STP for Middlesbrough residents

Desired Outcomes:

To influence the direction of the STP and assess whether the major reconfiguration of services is in the best interests of Middlesbrough residents

Terms of Reference:

- a) To examine the STP's joint vision and how it will translate into less health inequalities locally.
- b) To consider the integration work currently taking place across South Tees.
- c) To assess capacity in the independent nursing care market.
- d) To consider the pros and cons of moving to a capitation based funding approach.
- e) To examine the town wide focus on prevention.

Risks (if review was not undertaken):

Community is not fully engaged in the STP process or aware of what it may mean for them.

Residents may have to travel further for routine operations / services they previously accessed at JCUH.

Residents are not fully engaged in the Prevention Agenda – no behavioural change takes place resulting in no reduction in illness and no reduction in demand for acute service provision.

Acute reconfiguration in the NHS impacts on service provision by the LA but the LA is not actively involved in the planning / modelling of those changes and cannot meet the demand.

There is a greater reliance on the independent social care / independent nursing care provider market and the local market is unable to meet that increased / specialised demand.

System wide changes in the funding approach may result in Middlesbrough's population being adversely affected.

Transformational change takes place but reduced health inequalities / improved health outcomes for Middlesbrough residents are not achieved.
