# Middlesbrough Council Health Scrutiny EU Exit Preparations

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## Principles

- The NHS is apolitical!
- Planning has been ongoing for years for the NHS and social care
- We have assumed no deal for planning purposes
- We are using existing emergency planning routes for reporting and changes
- We are reporting on a daily basis to NHSE



## Local Arrangements

- GF is the lead across the 5 CCG areas
- Overall message is "We are ready, do not change your behaviours, be reassured and calm!"
- All NHS supplies with have category 1 priority at the ports and airports
- National logistics service is available if needed
- All suppliers have a 6 week buffer stock on the UK side of the border
- There are more EU nationals working in the NHS now than there were at the time of the referendum
- 80% of ordered flu vaccine is this side of the border by 31<sup>st</sup> October.
   This is more than the total administered last year



### What we have asked GPs to do locally

- Ensure all front line staff are aware: we are ready, do not alter your behaviour!
- Ensure all our EU nationals feel valued and have had the opportunity to understand/join the settled status scheme. Get the messages out that this does not mean they will lose EU citizenship
- DO NOT STOCKPILE LOCALLY, continue to order goods and medications as normal.



## Your Questions

#### Medication supplies:

- Where possible 6 week buffer stock in place
- National messages about not stockpiling
- Existing shortages (non EU Exit related) managed via existing processes (e.g.HRT)
- Serious shortages protocol in place (allows community pharmacies to substitute)
- GPs all aware
- Daily return to NHSE



## Middlesbrough

- No specific issues raised to us locally in relation to medication or other EU Exit related concerns
- We are working across Tees, Darlington and County Durham.
- Existing reporting mechanisms to be used
