# Learning and Access End of Year Report 2006-2007

The learning and Access team at Teesside Archives have worked with a variety of customer groups throughout the last year ensuring that the service has been accessible to clients from all four borough's, this has been achieved using a combination of outreach sessions and visits by groups to Teesside Archives.

In summary sessions have been delivered to a total of 557 customers which can be broken down into 336 school children ranging from KS1-KS3 and 221 adults.

The team have also attended various large-scale events in order to raise the profile of the service offered by Teesside Archives. This would be difficult to quantify actual numbers of customers reached.

### Summary

The Learning and Access team have provided a wide variety of learning opportunities both in house and outreach, to a diverse audience throughout the four borough's.

It is our aim to continue to improve on the work we have achieved in the last twelve months, however to increase the number of visitors to Teesside Archives a larger learning space would be essential as at the moment we can not accommodate a full class of pupils this therefore prevents many schools visiting us as they are unable to attend in small groups.
