

Prevention of Crime & Disorder

- A CCTV recording system shall be installed that is compliant with, and capable of, capturing an image of evidential standard.
- All CCTV recordings shall be maintained for a minimum of thirty-one (31) days with date & time-stamping. Cameras shall be installed so as to cover both internal and external areas of the premises. At least one camera shall cover ingress/egress points and at least one other camera shall cover the alcohol display area.
- 3. Notices shall be displayed advising that CCTV is in operation.
- 4. Staff shall be fully trained in the operation of the CCTV system and there shall be at least one member of staff on duty during trading hours who is able to provide copies of CCTV recordings to the Police and authorised officers of the Local Authority. Such copies shall, in any event, be provided within three (3) days.
- 5. When CCTV is not operating, no supply of alcohol shall be made on the premises. If a fault develops with the CCTV system, the duration and nature shall be recorded in a log to be made available for inspection by Police and authorised officers of the Local Authority upon demand.
- 6. All staff shall be instructed to record in an incident book/register all incidents of crime and disorder occurring at the premises, and details of any occasion when the police are called. These records shall include the time and date of any incident and the identities of staff members involved. The incident book/register shall be made available for inspection by Police and authorised officers of the Local Authority upon demand.
- 7. Alcohol shall not be sold in an open container or consumed in the licensed premises.

Protection of Children from Harm

8. The "Challenge 25"/"Think 25" proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises. All customers who appear under the age of 25 will be challenged to prove that they are over 18 when attempting to purchase alcohol. Acceptable forms of ID include a photo driving licence, passport, or home office approved identity card baring the holographic 'PASS' mark. If the

person seeking alcohol is unable to produce an acceptable form of identification, no sale or supply of alcohol shall be made to or for that person.

- 9. All staff shall be trained in the law about the sale of alcohol. Such training will include challenging every individual who appears to be under 25 years of age and to refuse service where individuals cannot produce acceptable means of identification, acceptable forms of ID and using the refusal register. Such training (including any refresher training) will be logged and provided not less than every six months. The training log will be made available for inspection by Police and authorised persons.
- 10. A refusals log must be kept at the premises and made immediately available on request to the police or an authorised person. The refusals log shall be inspected on a monthly basis by the DPS and noted in the log, and a record made in the log of any actions that appear to be needed to protect young people from harm. The log must record all refused sales of alcohol and include the following:
- a) the identity of the member of staff who refused the sale;
- b) the date and time of the refusal;
- c) the alcohol requested and reason for refusal;
- d) description of the person refused alcohol.
- 11. The following posters shall be displayed conspicuously on the premises in customer facing areas:
- a) "Think 25" or similar poster to advise potential purchasers that suitable proof of age will be required for all purchasers who appear to be under 25.



REASONS

- 1. The responsible authorities had for some considerable period of time been unable to establish who was in control of the premises, and this was an ongoing situation. As a result, the Premises Licence Holder (PLH) had failed to give the responsible authorities confidence that sales of alcohol had been or were being sufficiently regulated in accordance with the licensing conditions.
- 2. Having considered the application, representations by the Police, Public Health, Trading Standards and the Ward Councillors, and the representations/response of the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS), the Committee considered that there was a lack of overall management control at the premises and (up to August 2015), a lack of clarity in respect of who was in day to day control at the premises.
- 3. The overall failure by the PLH and the DPS to comply with the premises licensing conditions was of major concern to the Committee. The PLH and the DPS did not appear to recognise their responsibilities with regard to the licensing objectives, or to appreciate the importance of complying with the licensing conditions.
- 4. During a visit to the premises by the Police on Tuesday, 20 October 2015, the following breaches of licence conditions had been identified:-
- No training records were present for staff members;
- The DPS had been unable to access the CCTV system to demonstrate 31 days of recording;
- Two brands of "perry" products were on sale at the premises;
- The Refusals book had not had any entries since February 2014;

• The Incident book had not had any entries since May 2014 however there had been incidents reported to the police since this time.

The above breaches of conditions, coupled with previous underage sales of alcohol at the premises gave rise to serious concerns about the willingness and ability of both the PLH and the DPS, to ensure that the premises were operating in accordance with the premises licensing conditions to support the licensing objectives.

The Committee recognised that the current DPS had only taken over the premises in August 2015; however, the Committee considered that it was evident from the representations made, and from the Police visit on 20 October 2015, that the DPS had failed to implement robust systems to ensure adherence to the licensing conditions from the outset of his tenure.

Although the DPS produced copies of an Incident Book, Refusals Book and Training Records at the meeting, the records that were produced had periods where no incidents were recorded and the Training Record was not dated; in addition, the entries recorded were entered only after the Police visit on 20 October 2015.

The Committee had been advised by the Trading Standards Officer, as part of her evidence, that periods where no incidents had been recorded was unusual, and in the Committee's view, this cast some doubt on the validity of the records.

5. The Committee considered the details of the Police Occurrence Incident Logs relating to antisocial behaviour and alcohol fuelled anti-social incidents and determined that although none of the incidents could be directly attributable to the premises, there was evidence of problems of antisocial behaviour and underage sales of alcohol in the vicinity of the premises.

The Chair informed the parties to the hearing of their right to appeal the decision within 21 days of receiving the notice and full details of the decision and reasons will be sent in writing to the parties within five working days.

Cleveland Police have received an application for a new Premises Licence to be granted at 199 Borough Road, Middlesbrough. The application is for the sale of alcohol off the premises Monday – Sunday 06:00-23:00hrs. The applicant is a Muralitharan KANAGIASABAPATHI.

The premises previously had a Premises Licence for the off premises sale of alcohol; however due to prolific problems with the premises, in 2015 Cleveland Police made an application to review the current premises licence.

In December 2015 Middlesbrough Borough Council Licensing Committee made a decision to revoke the Premises licence upon hearing evidence from Cleveland Police in collaboration with evidence provided by Middlesbrough Council Licensing Department. This evidence documented the sale of alcohol to underage persons in January 2015, whereby staff/management at the premises were illusive and the person who made the sale could not be located. Issues surrounding anti social behaviour in the vicinity of the establishment were also highlighted.

The applicant; Muralitharan KANAGIASABAPATHI was the Designated Premises Supervisor for the premises from around 21st August 2015. A Premises Licence check was conducted at the address on 20th October 2015, whereby Muralitharan KANAGIASABAPATHI was present at the time. During this inspection the premises was found to be in breach of a large number of conditions attached to the Premises Licence; including issues once again with the display of the CCTV.

Cleveland Police have concerns that the premises have only recently been subject to a review of the Premises Licence following a catalogue of issues; some of which whilst under the day to day control of the applicant Muralitharan KANAGIASABAPATHI. It is the view of Cleveland Police that should this Premises Licence be granted the Crime and Disorder and Protection of Children from Harm licensing objectives will be undermined.

I am writing to you in relation to the above application which you have recently made to Middlesbrough Council Licensing Authority. I act on behalf of the Director of Public Health as the Responsible Authority for Health and I have been consulted on the above application.

In December 2015, members of Middlesbrough Council's licensing committee made a decision to revoke the premises licence in respect of the above premises after hearing evidence of an underage sale of alcohol from the premise, alcohol related anti- social behaviour and breaches in licensing conditions.

There are still concerns that if this premise is granted a licence, it will be operated in such a manner which would result in further undermining of the licencing objectives, in particular, Crime and Disorder, Public Safety and Protection of Children from Harm.

In addition, Middlesbrough Council have recently approved a Cumulative Impact Policy for Central ward and four other town centre wards, due to the high density of off licence premises in this area and the negative impact on the licensing objectives. Your premise is located within this Cumulative Impact Policy area and it is our opinion that your application should demonstrate how these premises will not negatively impact on the licensing objectives.

Therefore, I am advising you that a representation has been submitted to Middlesbrough Council's Licensing Authority by the Director of Public Health, as the Responsible Authority for Health in relation to the above application.

Evidence presented by Middlesbrough Council, responsible authority for health, against the application for a premises licence in respect of premises situated at 199 Borough Road, under the Licensing Act 2003

The Director of Public Health, as the Responsible Authority for health, is making a representation to this application on the grounds of Crime and Disorder, Public Safety and Protection of Children from Harm.

The application for the grant of a Premises Licence in respect of premises situated at 199 Borough Road has been made by Mr Muralitharan Kanagiasabapathi, who has named himself as the proposed Premises Licence holder and Designated Premises Supervisor for this premise.

In December 2015, during a review hearing, members of Middlesbrough Council's Licensing Committee heard evidence from Cleveland Police, Middlesbrough Council's Trading Standards and Public Health Officers which related to a sale of alcohol to children, alcohol related anti-social behaviour and breaches in conditions in accordance with the Premises Licence regarding 199 Borough Road. Also between January 2015 (when the underage sale was made) and August 2015, there had been concerns regarding the ownership of the business and the lack of accountability at the time of the underage sale. A male representative for the premise named Mr Muralitharan Kanagiasabapathi was present during the hearing. He confirmed that he was the named Designated Premises Licence holder on the Premises Licence in respect of these premises. He also confirmed that he had held this position since August 2015.

After hearing all of the evidence from all parties concerned, members of the Licencing Committee made the decision to revoke the licence, (see attached decision letter).

It is our opinion that the granting of a new premises licence in respect of these premises would undermine the Crime and Disorder, Public Safety, and Protection of Children from Harm licensing objectives.

Licensed premises must operate in such a manner to uphold the licensing objectives and the DPS has an important role to ensure a premise's operates within the law. There are concerns about the sale of alcohol to children. The availability of alcohol to young people increases their vulnerability and the risks to their health and safety. Consumption of alcohol at an early age can have serious implications for long term health and wellbeing. It is also evident that previously the Police identified breaches of licensing conditions in relation to the sale of "Perry" products at the time when Mr Kanagiasabapathi was responsible for the premises. These products along with white ciders have been identified as being highly desirable to young people as they are cheap to buy and have a strong ABV content (7.5%).

This premise is located within the Central ward but also within close proximity to the boundary of North Ormesby. Both wards are listed as being the most deprived wards within Middlesbrough. There is high unemployment, low education attainments, a predominance of privately rented properties, some of the poorest in Middlesbrough, and a high prevalence of ill health. Alcohol arrest data shows that these wards are both hotspot areas for alcohol related crime and that a high number of cases involve people drinking in the home. Irresponsible sales and the availability of cheap alcohol fuel crime and disorder.

There are 30 off licensed premises situated within Central ward. Approximately 60% of off licensed premises are situated within 5 ward areas of Middlesbrough: Central, Newport, Park, Longlands and Beechwood and North Ormesby. During 2014/2015 a high proportion of the alcohol related crimes, wholly attributable hospital admissions and crime and disorder incidents were recorded from these ward areas. This, together with the high density of off licence premises prompted the need for a Cumulative Impact Policy to be included in Middlesbrough Council's Licensing Policy 2016-2021. This Policy ensures that further off licence premises applications do not add to existing crime and disorder issues within these wards. It will also assist in the promotion of all licensing objectives and responsible and effective retailing.

Alcohol related data and intelligence has been gathered for Central and North Ormesby wards. Central ward has the highest number of alcohol attributable admissions to James Cook University Hospital.

Licensed premises must ensure alcohol is sold responsibly. It is very clear from the evidence that was presented at the hearing in December 2015 that this premise was being operated in such a way that undermined the licensing objectives of the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety and protection of children from harm. For this reason the Licensing Committee decided to revoke the licence. There are still concerns that if this premise is granted a licence it will be operated in such a manner that would once again undermine the licensing objectives, given that there does not appear to be any changes in the management of the premises nor does there appear to be any changes of, or new conditions added to the proposed operating schedule which would further promote the licensing objectives.

The applicant Mr Kanagiasabapathi was the designated Premises Supervisor for a business operating from this premise which had it's Alcohol License revoked at Middlesbrough Council's Licensing Committee in December 2015. This decision was made after the Committee heard evidence relating to concerns that sales of alcohol were being made to under 18's from this premise and concerns regarding the way the business was operating. Trading Standards had expressed concerns that the Police evidence presented showed that at the time of a Police test purchasing exercise on 21st January 2015, when 4 cans of Stella artois lager, were made to two 15 year old volunteers, no attempts had been made to prevent underage sales as no questions were asked of the volunteers and no ID was requested. Furthermore the cctv footage was not available as the unit had been thrown out and there were concerns about the conduct of staff involved in the premises when police visited the store on 24th January 2015.

Trading Standards had pointed out then, and it is still our position now that the business should ensure that they have robust systems in place to ensure that sales of alcohol are not being made to persons under 18 years.

At the hearing the police had presented evidence that when they conducted a licensing visit to this premises on 20th October 2015 various breaches of licensing conditions were found ,including a lack of training records,non use of refusal and incidents books,non access to CCTV records and the stocking of perry products. I had identified that this raised major concerns for Trading Standards about the way the business was being operated particularly in relation to the prevention of underage sales. Perry products were goods known to be desirable to young people due to their price and strong ABV content .

At the time of the licensing visit in October 2015 Mr Kanagiasabapathi, the applicant for this licence, was the designated premises supervisor and had been for a number of months. In this position he was responsible for ensuring that alcohol from the premises was sold responsibily in accordance with the licensing Act, that he understand the law relating to the licensing Act and upheld the licensing objectives in the operation of the business. The findings from the police during this licensing visit, evidence presented to the Licensing Committee in December 2015, showed that this had not been done. Furthermore examination of evidence produced by the applicant during the hearing showed that their procedures and the management of them in relation to underage sales was still inadequate, a fact which the Committee acknowledged in their decision.

The Licensing Committee had revoked the licence of a business operating from this premise after finding that the way it was being operated, during a time when it was under the day to day control of Mr Kanagiasabapathi, the person applying for this license, undermined the licensing objectives. It is the view of Trading Standards that if this premise is granted a licence the licensing objectives of Prevention of Crime and Disorder" and "Protection of Children from Harm" will be undermined, given that the same person is involved in the business.

Underage drinking is a major source of anti social behaviour within Middlesbrough. A risk taking behaviour roadshow survey of Middlesbrough Schoolchildren aged 13-14 years in 2013-14 identified that 29.4% had drank alcohol and 12.1% had got drunk on alcohol to the point of losing control. In addition 89.3% believed that most people their age group drank alcohol at least once a month. The local Alcohol profiles for England show that between 2010/11-2012/13 the North East
