

## Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

### Supply of Alcohol

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:

(a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

(b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

### Exhibition of Films

3. Where a premises licence authorises the exhibition of films, the licence must include a condition requiring the admission of children to the exhibition of any film to be restricted in accordance with this section.

4. Where the film classification body is specified in the licence, unless subsection (3)(b) applies, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that body.

5. Where-

(a) The film classification body is not specified in the licence, or

(b) The relevant licensing authority has notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.

6. In this section "Children" - means persons aged under 18; and "Film classification body" means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (c.39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification).

### Door Supervision

7. Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, that licence must include a condition that each such individual must:

(a) Be authorised to carry out that activity by a licence granted under the Private Security Industry Act 2001;

(b) Be entitled to carry out activity by virtue of section 4 of the Act.

8. But nothing in subsection (1) requires such a condition to be imposed:

(a) In respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c. 12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films); or

(b) In respect of premises in relation to:

(i) Any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or

(ii) Any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).

9. For the purposes of this section:

(a) "Security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1) (a) of that Schedule applies, and which is licensable conduct for the

purposes of that Act.

(b) Paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

#### Age Verification

10. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

11. The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

12. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

#### Permitted Price

13. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

14. For the purpose of this condition set out in paragraph 1:

(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula-

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where:

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or

officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

15. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

16. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Irresponsible Drink Promotions (applicable to 'on' & 'off' sales)

17. The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

18. In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises:

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to:

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise).

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;

(e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

19. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

**Alcoholic Drink Measures**

20. The responsible person must ensure that:

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."

## Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

### LICENSING OBJECTIVES

#### GENERAL - ALL FOUR LICENSING OBJECTIVES

1. Following an assessment of the premises and its surrounding area the following is proposed:

(i) 30 minutes 'drinking up' time will allow appropriate dispersal, use of lavatories etc.

(ii) The licensee reserves the right to move the fire appliances, awp machines, cigarette machines and or any other similar objects temporarily in a fixed location which may impact on the ability of individuals on the premises to use exits or escape routes without impediment.

#### THE PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER

1. Illumination provided to exterior of premises.
2. All interior trading areas visible from behind the bar servery.
3. Licensee/staff monitor customer behaviour especially during busy periods.
4. Always a minimum of 2 staff on duty at all times.
5. CCTV currently monitors the bar trading area.
6. Toilets checked regularly.
7. Drugs policy in place and adhered to.
8. All video footage recorded should be kept for a minimum period of 31 days and kept in a locked and secure cabinet.
9. An incident book detailing any incidents of crime and disorder should be kept at all times.
10. The premises should have a drugs register and an approved secure drugs box in which to place any prohibited drug substances found.
11. All glasses should be made of toughened glass where reasonably possible.
12. No person should be allowed to consume any drink in any outside area after 11.30pm.
13. On every Friday and Saturday evening whereby the premises is open to after midnight then a minimum of 2 SIA registered door supervisors shall be employed between 9pm and the premises closing. The above will also apply on the additional dates mentioned in the non standard timings section of the operating schedule.
14. The DPS or his representative shall attend the appropriate Pubwatch scheme.
15. To endeavour to ensure no glasses, open bottles or other containers shall be allowed to leave the licensed area in control of patrons.
16. No person under 18 years shall be present whether accompanied or not when exotic dancing takes place.
17. No all inclusive drink promotions at any time.

#### PUBLIC SAFETY

1. Current electric certificate in place.
2. Accident/incident book in place on site for staff and public.
3. The pub is equipped with emergency lighting, illuminated exit signs and a fire detection system throughout the entire building.
4. All fire fighting equipment serviced annually and there is a contract in place with R & G Ltd.
5. A fire alarm test is carried out every 6 weeks.
6. Health and Safety policy in place and adhered to.
7. Complies with a Smoking Charter.



#### **THE PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE**

1. There are no opening windows in the bar area and all entrance doors have internal lobbies.
2. Cellar cooling condenser is positioned in an area so as not to cause nuisance to neighbours.
3. All external doors and windows shall be kept closed when regulated entertainment is being provided except in the event of an emergency.
4. Bottles and other waste materials shall only be deposited into waste receptacles at the rear of the premises between the hours of 9am and 9pm on each day.

#### **THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN FROM HARM**

1. Unaccompanied children are not allowed on the premises and all children are not permitted on the premises after 8pm.
2. Children are not permitted in the bar area.
3. AWP and cigarette machine are on close proximity to the bar and therefore easily observed.
4. Under no circumstances will children be permitted on the premises during performances of exotic dance.

The Springfield Hotel is a Public house with various bed and breakfast type rooms above it, situated at 113 Borough Road, Middlesbrough. The premise has a licence to sell alcohol from 11-00am until 23 00pm, Monday to Thursday, from 11 00am until 01 00am, Friday and Saturday and from 12 00 noon until 22 30pm on Sundays.

Cleveland Police seek a review of the premises licence on grounds of public safety, the prevention of crime and disorder and the protection of children from harm.

In the last 12 months there have been repeated breaches of premises licence conditions, the conducting of licensable activity outside of permitted hours, violence at the premises, reports of underage drinking, smoking and serious public safety concerns relating to fire safety.

The situation is so bad that on Friday 9<sup>th</sup> November 2018 when officers from Cleveland Police, Middlesbrough Council and Cleveland Fire brigade conducted an inspection, the premises had to be closed for the following safety concerns

- The Fire warning system was inoperative and had been turned off from the mains electricity
- There was a lack of functioning emergency lighting
- There was a hole in the ceiling exposing the flats above to the risk of fire
- Flammable liquids were being stored in the main electrical distribution cupboard with further holes in the ceiling
- Means of escape from both the pub and flats were compromised

There is a distinct lack of direction and control from management who seem either unwilling or unable to resolve these issues.

The latest issues follow months of visits and meetings by Police, Council and Fire brigade to resolve these issues with management at the premises, for example

- 30/11/2017, A Routine inspection identified breaches of conditions including no CCTV system.
- 10/01/2018, A follow up visit by Police and Council identified no CCTV system and the fire escape was rendered inoperable by a stool wedged under the push bar to prevent it being opened
- 25/02/2018. The premises was conducting licensable activity outside of permitted hours including a person smoking inside the premises which was observed by council officer.
- 06/03/2018. A further revisit by Police, Council and Environmental Health officers, identified cigarette butts in staff and public area's. The fire escape was bolted shut despite being open to the public. During the visit, a member of staff purporting to be in charge gave false details.
- 09/03/2018. The premises was visited by Police, Council and the Fire brigade who observed the fire escape bolted despite the premises being open to the public.
- 10/03/2018 The premises was visited by the Fire Brigade who observed that the fire escape was still locked.
- 14/03/2018. The premises was visited by Police, Council and the Fire Brigade and observed the fire escape was still bolted, no body in charge of the premises was able to assist with the licensing inspection, given the fact that they had no knowledge of the conditions.
- 28/03/2018. A further visit by Police and Council Officers, identified that no one was able to operate the CCTV system to demonstrate it was compliant with the premises licence.

In addition to the licensing issues there have been a number of incidents of note including assaults, robberies and reports of drug misuse and underage drinking.

I am Pc 1845 Jason Arbuckle of Cleveland Police; I am currently attached to the Force Licensing unit and work at Middlesbrough Police station.

The Springfield Hotel is a licenced premise with various bed and breakfast type rooms above it and is situated at 113 Borough Road, Middlesbrough, TS1 3AX. The Licensable activities authorised by the licence for this premise are Live Music, Recorded Music, Performances of Dance, Sale of alcohol from 11am until 23 00hrs Monday to Thursday, 11am until 01 00am Fridays and Saturdays and from 12 (noon) until 22 30hrs on Sundays.

The Designated Premises Supervisor and Premises licence holder is Derek Hetherington, he took over on the 27<sup>th</sup> of April 2018 from the previous Designated Premises Supervisor and Premises licence holder, Jaslyn Foxton.

Even though Derek Hetherington is the current Designated Premises Supervisor and Premises licence holder, the actual business is operated by a male called Darren Hunter.



Continuation of Statement of **JASON ARBUCKLE**

On Thursday the 30<sup>th</sup> of November 2017, an inspection was conducted at the Premise by Cleveland Police, Middlesbrough Councils Licensing team and Middlesbrough Councils environmental health team. During the inspection, where Darren Hunter was present, it was established that the premise was not compliant with the conditions on the premise Licence, there was no CCTV system in place and no incident book, Darren Hunter stated that the Police had these items. Part A and Part B of the premises licence couldn't be produce either.

On Wednesday the 10<sup>th</sup> of January 2018, I attended the Springfield Hotel, Middlesbrough in the company of a Licensing Officer from Middlesbrough council, upon entering the premise I spoke to the member of staff on duty. I asked him who was in charge of the premise and he said Darren, a short time later, a male called Darren Hunter appeared whereupon he stated that he was in charge. I asked Mr Hunter if he was the DPS, he stated that Jaslyn Foxton was the DPS but he was in charge. As we were conducting a licensing check, I asked Mr Hunter if he could show us the CCTV system and show us that the CCTV system was retaining footage in accordance with the condition on the licence. The premise licence states that the establishment must have a CCTV system and retain the footage for 31 days. Mr Hunter informed me that the CCTV system is broken and had been for some time, therefore he doesn't have any CCTV footage at all. He stated that the Police seized the CCTV hard drive before Christmas, following a firearms incident. When they returned it, it was broken; he also stated that when the hard drive was returned, the Police Officer informed him that the Police would be in touch about a replacement hard drive. I told Mr Hunter that I would check into this. As I walked through the premise I noticed the fire exit at the back that leads to a car park was bolted at the top and the bottom, it also had a stool wedged in the push bar, this effectively meant that this fire


escape was out of action and couldn't be used in an emergency, I took a photograph of this, which I shall exhibit as Police item JSA/1. There was also another fire escape in the premise that leads onto Laurel Street, this was also blocked by stools and other items, again, this fire escape couldn't be used in an emergency. As it stood, the only way of exiting the premise in an emergency was via the main entry/exit door. Suitable advice was given to Darren Hunter with regards to the fire escape.

Upon returning to the Police station I spoke to Detective Sergeant Wild, who had dealt with the firearms incident, he stated that the hard drive was seized from the premise as it was crucial to the investigation and this was the only way of securing the footage, he stated that at some point whilst in Police custody, the hard drive was damaged beyond repair. On the 15<sup>th</sup> of December 2017, the damaged hard drive was returned to the Springfield Hotel and they were told to obtain a new hard drive and Cleveland Police would reimburse them.

On the 11<sup>th</sup> of January 2018, I telephoned the DPS, Jaslyn Foxton and informed her about what we had discovered the day before, she was informed that the premise has not had a CCTV system in place for several months and that she was to obtain a new system ASAP and Cleveland Police would pay.

On the 17<sup>th</sup> of January 2018, I returned to the Springfield Hotel with an Officer from Middlesbrough councils Licensing team and spoke to Darren Hunter, he showed me that they did now have a working CCTV system, however, there was only three camera's working, and Darren Hunter stated that they would have 18 camera's working within two days.



On the 19<sup>th</sup> of January 2018, I returned to the Springfield Hotel, at this time, they had 7 camera's working, not the 18 that had been promised.

On the 2<sup>nd</sup> of February 2018, a meeting was held at Middlesbrough Police station involving Cleveland Police, Middlesbrough council's Licensing team and members of the food & safety team, present from the Springfield Hotel was the DPS, Jaslyn Foxton and her husband. At that meeting, various issues were discussed ranging from licence breaches, drinking alcohol after permitted hours and drug taking at the premise, Jaslyn stated that she was unaware of any of these issues but would look into it and address them all, she also stated that as DPS, she attends the Springfield Hotel at least three times a week and stays there for about 20 minutes.

On the 26<sup>th</sup> of February 2018, I attended the Springfield Hotel with an Officer from Middlesbrough councils Licensing team and spoke to Darren Hunter, at this time he handed me a memory stick containing CCTV footage from the 25<sup>th</sup> of February 2018, (This is the night the premise held a lock in, which was witnessed by a Licensing Officer from Middlesbrough Council). Darren stated that he intended to sack the male called "Colin" who was working at the time of the lock in.

I checked the footage on the memory stick, it showed three camera's and was timed at 01 35hrs, the footage showed that the premise still had a lot of customers in it, far more than it should have however, because of the way the cameras were positioned it was difficult to ascertain exactly what was happening in the establishment. Upon seeing this, I telephoned Darren Hunter and asked for some more CCTV footage, he stated that he would do this providing I gave him the memory stick back.



On the 6<sup>th</sup> of March 2018, I attended the Springfield Hotel with an Officer from Middlesbrough councils Licensing team and an Officer from the food team, Darren Hunter was not present and I was unable to speak to Jaslyn Foxton, as she was not answering her telephone, at the premise, I spoke to the only member of staff on duty, the staff member who wasn't very helpful, stated that she was called Marie Duffy, however, the female was acting oddly, when pressed, she stated that she had given false details and wasn't called Marie Duffy, she couldn't offer an explanation as to why she had lied to me, whilst we conducted the visit, I noticed various metal pots in the kitchen area that contained cigarette ash and cigarette butts, I also noticed cigarette ash and cigarette butts in the cellar and bar area, it was fairly clear that someone was smoking in the premise. As I walked around the premise, I noticed issues with both fire escapes, the fire escape that leads to Laurel Street was blocked by tables and chairs and couldn't be used in an emergency and the fire escape that leads to a car park at the rear was padlocked, again, this fire escape couldn't be used in an emergency. A licensing check was not conducted, as the female who had given false details was unable to assist us with the things we needed to check.

On the 9<sup>th</sup> of March 2018, another visit was made to the premise with a Middlesbrough council Licensing officer and a Fire Officer from Cleveland Fire Brigade to ascertain if the issues we had previously discovered had been rectified. At this time Darren Hunter and Jaslyn Foxton were not present, the female who had given false details previously was on duty again, I left the memory stick with this female and informed her that she needed to pass the memory stick to Darren Hunter, so he could provide more CCTV footage. Given the fact that I've met this female before, I knew we

would be unable to conduct a licensing check. I checked the rear fire exit, again, I saw that it couldn't be used in an emergency, it was bolted locked. After speaking with this female, we unbolted the bolts, however, the fire door wouldn't open, a male who didn't appear to be staff, had to retrieve a key from the behind bar to unlock the door, upon the rear fire being unlocked, the male advised us that the push bar on the door was broken and had been for some time and that people had been accessing the premises by this escape and had been stealing from the gaming machines, this was the reason it was being kept locked. It was also noticed that the fire escape that leads onto Laurel Street was blocked by tables and chairs and was padlocked.

On Saturday the 10<sup>th</sup> of March 2018, Cleveland Fire Service attended the premise, during their inspection, the Fire Service discovered that the fire exit that leads onto Laurel Street and the fire exit that leads to the car park at the rear were both locked.

On the 14<sup>th</sup> of March 2018, another visit was made to the premise, at this time I was in the company of an Officer from Middlesbrough Councils Licensing unit and a Fire Officer from Cleveland Fire Brigade. Darren Hunter was not available but was spoken to over the telephone, he stated that due to a family issue, he wouldn't be able to attend the premise but he would get Derek Hetherington to pop down, at that time, we believed that Derek Hetherington worked for the owner of the building. I tried telephoning Jaslyn Foxton but she didn't answer. A short time later, Derek Hetherington arrived. Given the fact that no one at the premise was able to operate the CCTV and assist us with checking the conditions on the premise licence, we were again unable to conduct a licensing check.

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

Upon checking the fire escapes at the premise, I could clearly see that the side fire escape that leads onto Laurel street was still locked but it had had all signage near it removed, clearly indicating that it was not to be used as a fire escape anymore. The rear fire exit was still bolted and could not be used in an emergency, Derek Hetherington stated that this fire escape was going to repaired/fixed and that was going to happen on the 15<sup>th</sup> of March 2018. As a result of all the issues, breaches of the conditions on the premise licence, the fact that Jaslyn Foxton, the DPS, never seemed to be at the premise and was difficult to get hold of, sealed letters were left with Derek Hetherington for the attention of Jaslyn Foxton and Darren Hunter, the letters were inviting them to Middlesbrough Police station for an interview in accordance with PACE.

On the 28<sup>th</sup> of March 2018, I attended the premises; again, I was in the company of an Officer from Middlesbrough councils licensing team. At the premise I spoke to the male member of staff on duty, he stated that Jaslyn Foxton was not present and he hadn't seen her for days, I briefly spoke to Jaslyn on the telephone, she stated that she was unable to attend. I also spoke to Darren Hunter; he stated that he was too ill to attend. A short time after we arrived, Derek Hetherington appeared, again, we were unable to conduct a licensing check, as Derek and the male member of staff were unable to assist with checking the conditions on the premises licence, behind the bar and near the till, we did manage to find the refusals register, however, it was being used as an incident book and the last recorded incident occurred on the 31/07/2016.

With regards to interviewing Jaslyn Foxton and Darren Hunter, arrangements had been initially made for the 29<sup>th</sup> of March 2018; these arrangements were changed to the 11<sup>th</sup> of April 2018. Due to

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

circumstances beyond his control, Darren Hunter was unable to attend, however, for no apparent reason Jaslyn Foxton did not attend, I tried calling her but got no answer, as such, I attended the Springfield Hotel, Jaslyn Foxton was not present, however, the letter we had left for her on the 14<sup>th</sup> of March was still behind the bar.

On the 19<sup>th</sup> of April 2018, Both Darren Hunter and Jaslyn Foxton were interviewed in accordance with PACE at Middlesbrough Police station with regards to the premise and the running of it.

On Friday the 9<sup>th</sup> of November 2018, I visited the premise in the company of another Police Officer, a Licensing Officer from Middlesbrough Council and a Fire Officer from Cleveland Fire Brigade. As I entered the premise via the front door, I noticed two males stood at the entrance of the premise, both males were drinking alcohol from cans and one of males had a pool/snooker cue in his hand, whilst inside the premise I noticed that loud music was being played and there was about 25-30 people inside, the majority of these people were drinking alcohol from cans. I also noticed that Darren Hunter was present, after speaking with several people; I noticed that the Fire Officer was talking to Darren Hunter near a pool table; I could tell that Darren Hunter was not happy about something, as I walked over; Darren Hunter was being aggressive towards the Fire Officer as they discussed one of the fire exits. A short time later, I followed Darren Hunter, as he was going to show the Fire Officer where the fire alarm system was, we walked through a door from the bar area and entered a hallway, when I was stood in the hallway with the door I had just walked through behind me, there was a small room/cupboard directly in front of me which contained the electrical box and which full of old carpets etc, to my left, was a door that leads out onto Laurel Street, to my right,

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

was a staircase, this is the staircase that the residents who live in the hotel use to gain access to the first floor, also on my right and on the wall was the fire alarm system itself. The fire alarm system door was pulled open to reveal the control panel, there was no lights on and no sound, as such, I formed the opinion that the system was not turned on, Darren Hunter pressed a few buttons on the control panel but nothing happened, he then walked into the small room/cupboard and opened up the electrical box, all the switches were in the on position except one, which was switched off, this switch was labelled "Pub Fire Alarm". Darren Hunter turned this switch on and immediately the fire alarm system burst into life, lights started flashing and an alarm started sounding, it was fairly obvious that there was an issue with the fire alarm system, after a few seconds, the electrical switch was turned off and everything went quiet. I instantly got the impression that there was an issue with the Fire alarm system and rather than fix it, the whole system was turned off by turning the power to it off. At this point, Darren Hunter made reference to the fact that he had recently used a company called "North East" to sort out his fire system. I took some photographs of both the fire alarm system and the electrical box; I shall exhibit them as Police item JSA/2a, 2b, 2c, 2d

As a result of what had just happened with the fire alarm system and other issues that the Fire Officer had discovered, he made some telephone calls to the on call Fire safety Officer to discuss the matter, given the concerns; the on call Fire Safety Officer later attended the premise. At this point, Darren Hunter was informed that the premise could be getting closed on a voluntary basis because of the concerns surrounding fire safety.

A short time later, a fire appliance with full fire crew attended the premise and started installing smoke alarms on the first floor for the benefits of the residents living there; another fire appliance with full fire crew attended the premise to assist the first fire crew.

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

Upon this happening, I spoke to Darren Hunter again about closing the premise due to fire safety concerns, he stated that when he gets the word from the Fire brigade, he will close the premise and not before because he has a business to run. It was at this point that I noticed a male who was a resident on the first floor kept wandering from his room to the bar area and back again, this male was clearly intoxicated and should not have been served, however, every time he went to the bar he returned with another can of alcohol.

As I was stood waiting on the first floor, I heard some sort of commotion going on in the bar area, I walked downstairs and looked into the bar area, other than seeing Darren Hunter talking to a male, nothing was going on, several minutes later, Darren Hunter approached me and said, "I'M SORRY ABOUT THAT JASE, I'M NOT HAVING THAT, SOME CHEEKY BASTARD HAS PUT A LOADS OF DRUGS IN THE DISABLED TOILETS AND LEFT, I'VE WHACKED HIM AND BINNED THE DRUGS". Given the fact that the male had already gone and the drugs had been disposed of and I was assisting the Fire brigade, nothing more could be done.

Finally, after consultation with the on call fire safety Officer, a decision was made to allow the first floor to remain open, therefore the 14 residents didn't need to be re housed but the licensed area, I.e., the Springfield Hotel was to be closed on a voluntary basis on the advice of the Fire brigade because of concerns about fire safety. Darren Hunter was fully informed about this, he was informed that the premise is to remain closed until all the issues discovered by the Fire Service had been rectified, he was informed that the premise was not to re-open until the Fire Service had been out and inspected the premises to ensure that the fire safety work had been carried out to a satisfactory standard, he was told to turn off as much electrical equipment as possible and keep the door that


leads from the bar area to the residential area locked. Darren Hunter agreed to this and signed the Fire Officer contemporaneous notes to acknowledge this. I then countersigned these notes.

I have since obtained a report from the Fire Officer detailing what the serious concerns were at the premise; I shall exhibit a copy of this report as Police item JSA/3.

On Saturday the 10<sup>th</sup> of November 2018, about 12 45hrs, a Plain Clothed Police Officer attended the Springfield Hotel, the front doors of the premise were shut and no one responded to knocking. The Officer then tried the door on Laurel Street and discovered that it was open, as he went into the premise, he noticed several people working on the fire alarm system, he asked if Darren Hunter was present and he was told that he was in the bar, the Officer walked through the door that leads to the bar and discovered upwards of 12 people drinking and playing pool, Darren Hunter was stood behind the bar, when spoken too, he stated that no one was buying drinks and that all the persons were his friends. The cash till was checked, however, the Officer was informed that the money in it was the float. As the Officer spoke to Darren Hunter, he noticed a female sat at a table smoking a cigarette, this was pointed out to Darren Hunter who told her to go outside, he then said to the Officer, "YOU NEVER SAW THAT DID YOU!"

A short time later, the Officer returned to the premise with another Police Officer who took some video footage, I shall exhibit this footage as JSA/4, the premise still had people inside drinking, they also noticed that the front doors had some wood across, which would have prevented anyone getting in or out quickly. Suitable advice was given to Darren Hunter with regards to the implications of what was going on, at this point; he asked the Officer if he had a telephone number for Cleveland


Fire Brigade, this seemed an unusual request as Darren Hunter had been left the relevant telephone numbers the night before.

I have conducted some research on Cleveland Police Computers with regards to the Springfield Hotel, I have compiled a table detailing some of the incidents I have found. With regards incident number 8 in the table,

On the 14<sup>th</sup> of July 2018, the premise held a Drum and Base session, at 22 00hrs a vulnerable 16 year old female was seen outside of the venue with a number of older males by a school teacher. The female also disclosed to her social worker that she had been inside the Springfield Hotel on the night in question and that she goes there when they have under 18's events on, she also stated that under 18's are supposed to be out of the premise by a certain time, however, she feels she looks older and has never been challenged with regards to her age, so she stays. Darren Hunter was spoken too with regards to this incident, he stated that on the 14<sup>th</sup> of July 2018, the premise was having a younger persons drum and base session, whereby the clientele were all meant to be 18 years or older, he stated that anyone under that age should have left the premises by 20 30.

Even though Darren Hunter's name does not appear on the Premises Licence as either the Designated Premises Supervisor or Premises Licence Holder, it is widely accepted that he is the man in charge of the premise, during a tape recorded interview he stated to Police that he runs the

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

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premise, it's his business and that the previous Designated Premises Supervisor, Jaslyn Foxton was employed by him. I have also found a newspaper article from the Evening Gazette, which clearly shows that Darren Hunter is the land lord, I shall exhibit this article as Police item JSA/5

Given the repeated breaches of licence conditions, the issues surrounding management and serious concerns surrounding public safety, Cleveland Police have no alternative but to seek a review of the premises licence.

With regards the above address major issues were identified that lead to the Fire Service taking enforcement action in the form of a prohibition notice. This notice prohibited the use of the commercial premises but allowed sleeping on the upper floors to continue. During the inspection two fire appliances from Middlesbrough were called to the premises to assist in the installation of domestic smoke alarms on the upper floors as an interim measure. My concerns were so serious that I also requested the attendance of the on duty fire safety officer and also informed the head of the Fire Engineering Department.

Issues identified:

- There is a lack of functioning emergency lighting throughout the premises.
- There is a hole in the ceiling in the bar area which exposes the flats above to the risk of fire.
- The fire warning system was switched off. The RP stated that an electrician must have turned it off when working on something else earlier that day. Once instructed to turn the system on it appeared to show numerous faults and immediately entered full alarm. In my opinion this is why the system had been turned off. This with the lack of compartmentation in the bar area, with the hole in the ceiling and damaged internal door from bar to flats above, left the occupants in the flats in mortal danger from fire. Had a fire occurred in the premises it would have spread to the flats above and there was no way of warning those residents of the fire which could have led to numerous fatalities. The decision was then taken by myself to restrict the use of the building and prohibit the commercial side of the premises.

- Flammable material were being stored in the main electrical distributions cupboard which also had holes in the ceilings which would allow for fire spread and compromise the flats above and also the means of escape.
- A fridge was found in the means of escape. Means of escape should be completely sterile and free to use by all people at all times.
- The external means of escape passes room windows. These windows are required to be fire windows and would need to be shut at all times. At the time of the inspection it was not possible to determine whether these windows were fire rated.
- The secondary means of escape from the residential side was inadequate. There was water damage, hanging wires, a manual call point hanging off the wall and the emergency exit door required forcing to open.

The attitude of the RP was extremely poor. He was confrontational and aggressive. His attitude to Fire Safety is also very poor.

The RP was informed that no one was allowed in the premises apart from the engineer who was coming to fix the fire warning system. Information was passed to the Brigade the following day stating that the pub was open. Station Manager Simpson and Station Manager Jones subsequently visited the pub and found it to be open with the engineer just about to complete his works. This also shows a complete disregard from the RP who signed a legal document stating that he understood that the premises was to remain closed until the fire service were satisfied with the works carried out. He was informed, and signed to say he understood, to contact Middlesbrough Fire Station and also SM Simpson prior to allowing customers back in the premises.

SM Simpson requested that the fire warning system be tested whilst he was on the premises and the test carried out was satisfactory and the prohibition of the commercial side was lifted.

Reading through our previous job notes on the premises it should be noted that the RP was informed in December 2017 to either block the door up between the pub and the domestic side (where the fire panel was) or install a 60min fire door. Neither of which have been done. There were also issues back in December 2017 with the fire alarm system. Single point domestic alarms were installed as an interim and the RP informed Steve Beamson (Local Authority Housing) that the alarm system was to be fixed by 5pm on that day.

A pub and hotel manager has denied being responsible for allowing smoking in his bar.

Darren Hunter is in charge at the Springfield Hotel, in central Middlesbrough.

A Middlesbrough Council prosecution alleges that on February 25 this year patrons inside the Borough Road boozer were seen to be smoking by council investigators.

Hunter, 52, represented himself at Teesside Magistrates' Court and denied the charge.

He claimed he was not working on the night in question, but would call those staying at the hotel as witnesses and had CCTV footage.

Smoking has been against the law in pubs and all enclosed work places since July 2007.

Hunter, of Durham Road, was given seven days to instruct a solicitor and provide witness details ahead of a trial on December 17 at the same court.

He was given unconditional bail until that date.

I am a police constable in the Cleveland police presently posted to the licensing support unit at Middlesbrough Police station.

At 12:45pm on Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> November 2018 I was on duty when I attended the Springfield Hotel at 113 Borough Road, Middlesbrough.

The purpose of my visit was to check if the premises were open as I had received information that the previous evening it had closed 'voluntarily' due to problems with the fire alarm system.

As I drove past the premises I noticed that the external doors were closed so I parked my vehicle in Laurel Street at the side of the Springfield and walked round to the front doors.

There was no handle for me to attempt to open the doors so I knocked on the doors twice but received no answer.

As I returned to my car I tried the side door which allows access to the flats above as well as the premises and this door was open.

As I entered I saw several persons who appeared to be working on the fire alarm so I asked one of them if 'Darren' was about.

'Darren' is a male who I know to be called Darren Hunter who works at the premises whom I have had previous dealings with.

I was told that Darren was in the bar so I pushed the door open and went into the bar.

As I entered I saw there were 2 males playing pool and as I walked further in to the bar I saw several persons stood at the bar consuming alcohol.

Darren Hunter was behind the bar and whilst waiting for him I looked around and saw approximately 12 persons in the premises.

There were persons at the bar as well as sitting at a table and others were at the fire door at the rear of the pub.

There was a strong smell of cigarette smoke and I saw a female sat at a table with a male smoking what appeared to be a cigarette.

I watched her for a short time just to make sure it was a real cigarette or an electronic one but as she kept on smoking I realised it was a real cigarette due to her exhaling smoke and the cigarette went down as she smoked it.

I then spoke to Mr Hunter about the premises being open but he said that no persons were buying drinks and that they were all friends.

He showed me a tray from the till which had money in but he claimed that this was the float.

I pointed out the female smoking the cigarette and Mr Hunter went over to her and told her to go outside and smoke the cigarette which she did and went to the rear of the pub and out of the fire escape.

Mr Hunter then said to me 'YOU NEVER SAW THAT DID YOU'

I finished my visit and left the premises but returned a short time later in company with Pc2175 Ryan who had recording equipment.

I again spoke to Mr Hunter and advised him of what we intended to do.


Pc Ryan filmed persons inside the premises drinking alcohol as well as the inside of the front doors which had 2 pieces of wood pushed through the handles preventing easy exit/entrance.

As we left I explained to Mr Hunter that given the voluntary closure from the previous evening, it would be best if all the customers left the premises and he closed until he got the problems with the fire alarm sorted out.

He told me that it was getting done so we left but I later returned at 3:05pm in company with Pc894 Thorpe and 2 officers from Cleveland fire brigade.

The front doors to the premises were open at this time with persons stood outside.

The fire alarm system was working and Mr Hunter was allowed to remain open by the fire officers.

Cleveland Fire Brigade are of the opinion that the Licensee is not proactive when dealing with Fire Safety Issues within the premises.

Over the past 12 months the Fire Brigade has dealt with 11 instances at the premises all relating to safety.

The latest incident The situation is so bad that on Friday 9<sup>th</sup> November 2018 when officers from Cleveland Police, Middlesbrough Council and Cleveland Fire brigade conducted an inspection, the premises had to be closed for the following safety concerns

- The Fire warning system was inoperative and had been turned off from the mains electricity
- There was a lack of functioning emergency lighting
- There was a hole in the ceiling exposing the flats above to the risk of fire
- Flammable liquids were being stored in the main electrical distribution cupboard with further holes in the ceiling
- Means of escape from both the pub and flats were compromised

Previous inspections by the fire service have identified the following issues:

- 30/11/17 – Means of giving warning inoperable due to water egress to the electricity board
- 09/03/18 – Locked fire escapes
- 13/03/18 - Letter issued to the responsible person stating fire doors must be available to relevant persons at all times, any further instances and enforcement action would be taken
- 09/11/18 – As detailed above resulting in a voluntary closure of the premises
- 10/11/18 – Relevant persons found to be on the premises even though responsible person was told to inform Fire Service prior to allowing relevant persons back in the premises.
- 07/12/18 – Fire service informed by Cleveland Police that there was a fault on the fire alarm system.

Grounds for representation (including details of any previous representations)

This premises currently holds a Premises Licence under the Licensing Act 2003 authorising the sale of alcohol between 1100hrs and 2300hrs Monday to Thursday, 1100hrs to 0100hrs Friday and Saturday and 1200hrs to 2230hrs Sunday. The premises licence was first granted on 25 October 2005.

In light of evidence provided by Cleveland Police, The Fire Service, Environmental Health and Licensing Officers own findings during Licensing Act inspections the

Licensing Department has serious concerns in relation to the running of the business and the management's non-compliance with legislative requirements.

Licensing Officers have visited the premises on numerous occasions in the past year and on each occasion have had concerns regarding breaches of conditions attached to the premises licence. Some of the issues that have caused concern regarding these premises include carrying out licensable activities beyond the licensable hours, smoking being permitted within the premises and fire exits being bolted shut. It is also of great concern to the Licensing department that Officers from the Council have not felt safe to visit the premises without being accompanied by Police due to the aggressive, intimidating manner and language used by Mr Darren Hunter.

The attached statements submitted by Licensing and Enforcement Officers Neil Williams and Scott Lawrence provide an account of the observations made and necessary actions taken by Officers working in partnership with other Officers from Cleveland Police, Fire Service and the Council's Environmental Health Service.

A chronology of the issues, expanded upon in detail within the Officers' statements, relating to these premises is listed below:

**25 November 2013** - Application to transfer the premises licence for the premises into the name of Mr Derek Hetherington was granted by the Licensing Authority.

**29 November 2013** - Application to vary the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) for the premises into the name of Mr Derek Hetherington was granted by the Licensing Authority.

**16 August 2014** – Warning issued to Derek Hetherington following breach of the below condition. **See NW1**

- All external doors and windows shall be kept closed when regulated entertainment is being provided except in the event of an emergency.

**28 September 2016** – The annual fee for the premises licence was not paid by the required date.

**12 October 2017** - The annual fee for the premises licence was not paid by the required date.

**30 November 2017, 3pm** – A routine Inspection by Licensing and Police and Officers spoke to Darren Hunter.

- The premises was found to be not complying with the conditions of the premises licence.
- Mr Hunter was unable to produce Part A & B of the premises licence.
- CCTV was not recording.
- The incident book was unavailable to view.

An inspection report was left with Mr Hunter highlighting the breaches of Licensing conditions.



**01 December 2017** – A copy of the inspection report was sent to Miss Jaslyn Foxton who was the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) at that time.

**10 January 2018** – A follow-up visit to the premises was carried out by Licensing and Police and Officers spoke to Mr Hunter.

- Mr Hunter confirmed to Officers that there was no CCTV system currently installed at the premises.
- Officers also advised Mr Hunter regarding the use of a small stool which was being used to hold the push bar for the fire escape in place at the rear of the premises and the fire escape was also locked by bolts at the top and bottom of the door.

**11 January 2018** – PC Arbuckle confirmed that Police Officer had seized the CCTV system and that the system was returned to the Premises damaged.

**17 January 2018** – A further follow-up visit to the premises was carried out by Licensing & Police.

- A new CCTV system had been installed which had a total of three cameras recording footage.
- Mr Hunter advised Officers he would install more cameras to provide a greater coverage of the premises within two days.

**19 January 2018** – A further follow-up visit to the premises was carried out by Licensing & Police.

- CCTV system had seven cameras recording.

**30 January 2018** – An anonymous complaint was forwarded to the Licensing department from environmental health. **See NW2**

**02 February 2018** – A meeting was held at Cleveland Police Station with Miss Jaslyn Foxton. See the statement of Neil Williams for details of the meeting

**25 February 2018** – Licensing Officer observed a 'lock in' and smoking taking place at the premises.

**26 February 2018** – Officers from Licensing & Police visited the premises and Mr Hunter was advised of the observations made by a Licensing Officer on 25/02/2018.

- PC Arbuckle advised Mr Hunter that it was his intention to write to him and the DPS Miss Foxton with a view to interviewing them both at the Police Station at a later date.

**06 March 2018** – A further follow-up visit to the premises was carried out by Licensing, Police and Environmental Health.

- Officers were unable to carry out a Licensing Act inspection due to the lack of knowledge regarding the Licence on the part of the person in charge at that time.
- The member of staff on duty provided false details to Police.
- There was evidence of smoking had been taking place in the premises

- The rear fire escape was again found to be bolted shut. The fire escape at the side of the premises was blocked by bar furniture and upon further inspection the outer fire escape door was padlocked shut.

**09 March 2018** – A further follow-up visit to the premises was carried out by Licensing, Police and the Fire service.

- Staff member could not assist Officers with a Licensing Act inspection due to her lack of knowledge regarding the Licence.
- Officers again found the rear fire escape door to be bolted shut and upon unbolting the door Officers were still unable to open the fire escape.

**10 March 2018** – The Fire service visited the premises at 9.15pm and found both rear and side fire escapes locked.

**14 March 2018** – A further follow-up visit to the premises was carried out by Licensing, Police and the Fire service. Officers spoke to Mr Derek Hetherington at that time.

- The rear fire escape was bolted shut, advice was given by the Fire Service and Mr Hetherington confirmed the Fire Escape would be repaired the following day.
- No staff present during the visit could assist Officers with a Licensing Act inspection.
- Officers left letters for Mr Hunter & Miss Foxton.

**28 March 2018** – A further follow-up visit to the premises was carried out by Licensing & Police.

- Derek Hetherington attended the premises but could not operate the CCTV.
- The refusals register was being used and an incident book was on site but no incidents had been recorded since 31/07/2016.
- The rear fire escape was not bolted and appeared to be in working order.

**19 April 2018** Miss Foxton and Mr Hunter were separately interviewed under caution at the Police station. See statement of Neil Williams for details of interviews.

**27 April 2018** - Premises Licence was transferred into the name of Mr Derek Hetherington and as part of this application Mr Hetherington was also listed as the new DPS.

**14 May 2018** - Anonymous letter was received at the Licensing Office. See NW3

**09 November 2018** Officers from Licensing, Cleveland Police and the Fire Service attended the premises to conduct a routine inspection and at the time of the inspection the person in charge was Mr Hunter.

- Officers from the Fire Service chose to prohibit the use of the commercial bar area by members of the public.
- It was also noted that Mr Hunters manner was confrontational and aggressive.

- Officers raised concerns regarding alcohol being sold to a clearly intoxicated male.

**11 December 2018** – Mr Hunter attended the Licensing Office and recorded conversations with Licensing Officers. **See NW4**

**17 December 2018** – Mr Hunter was found guilty at Teesside Magistrates Court of failing to prevent persons smoking in the premises.

Section 4.31 of the Licensing Act 2003 states the following:

Every Premises Licence that authorises the sale of alcohol must specify a Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS). This will normally be the person who has been given day to day responsibility for running the premises by the Premises Licence holder. It is of great concern to the Licensing Authority that by Mr Hunters own admission he has employed people to be the Premises Licence holder and DPS for this premise and on each occasion Officers have attended the premises they have invariably not been able to speak to the DPS and Mr Hunter has been the person in charge of the day to day running of the premises.

When carrying out regulatory duties, on occasions Officers are met with hostility from customers at licensed premises, however the level of aggression and hostility shown towards Officers by Mr Hunter during routine visits has led to Officers to require the presence of Police Officers to ensure their safety.

I fully support the review of the Premises Licence for the Springfield Hotel submitted by Cleveland Police. Due to the concerns of Officers from the Licensing authority and other agencies, it is the view of the Licensing Authority, in its role as a Responsible Authority, that consideration should be given to the revocation of the Premises licence for the purpose of promoting the licensing objectives for public safety, the prevention of crime and disorder and the protection of children from harm. It is also of great concern that Mr Darren Hunter has been continuously responsible for the day to day management of the premises for some time, and appears to be acting as the premises supervisor. However, due to his conduct Mr Hunter is not a suitable person to be involved in the management or supervision of licensed premises

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I am employed by Middlesbrough Council in the post of Licensing Enforcement Officer in the Licensing Section of the Supporting Communities.

I am authorised in writing to carry out duties on behalf of Middlesbrough Borough Council in respect of the Licensing Act 2003. I hold the BIIAB Level 2 National Certificate for Licensing Practitioners.

Having made a check of Council records, I can confirm the following:

On 25 November 2013, an application to transfer the premises licence for the Springfield Hotel, 113 Borough Road, Middlesbrough into the name of Mr Derek Hetherington was granted by the Licensing Authority.

On 29 November 2013, an application to vary the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) for the Springfield Hotel, 113 Borough Road, Middlesbrough into the name of Mr Derek Hetherington was granted by the Licensing Authority.

On 16 August 2014, following receipt of a complaint relating to noise nuisance emanating from the premises, Licensing Officers conducted monitoring checks of the premises during an evening enforcement exercise. During these monitoring visits, it was evident that the front external doors to the premises were open and as a result, music from the premises could be heard at the roadside. A condition of the licence at that time stated:

- All external doors and windows shall be kept closed when regulated entertainment is being provided except in the event of an emergency.

As a result of Officers observations a warning letter was sent to Mr Derek Hetherington who was the premises licence holder and the DPS at that time. I hereby exhibit marked NW1 a copy of said letter.

On 28 September 2016 a letter was sent to Mr Hetherington notifying him that the Premises Licence annual fee was due to be paid before 23 November 2016. This letter further advised Mr Hetherington that should the fee not be paid then the licence may be suspended. As the annual fee was not paid a further letter was sent to Mr Hetherington informing him that the fee had not been paid, and should the fee not be paid by the 14<sup>th</sup> December 2016 then the licence

would be suspended. On the 14<sup>th</sup> December Mr Hetherington attended the Licensing Office and paid the annual fee.

On 22 August 2017, an application to transfer the premises licence and vary the DPS for the Springfield Hotel, 113 Borough Road, Middlesbrough into the name of Miss Jaslyn Foxton was granted by the Licensing Authority.

On 12 October 2017 a letter was sent to Miss Jaslyn Foxton who was the premises licence holder and DPS at that time notifying her that the Premises Licence annual fee was due to be paid before 23 November 2017. This letter further advised Miss Foxton that should the fee not be paid then the licence may be suspended. As the annual fee was not paid a further letter was sent to Mrs Foxton informing her that the fee had not been paid and should the fee not be paid by the 14<sup>th</sup> December 2016 then the licence would be suspended. On the 13<sup>th</sup> December 2017 a letter along with a notice of suspension was hand delivered to Miss Foxton at the Springfield Hotel. The letter and notice informed Miss Foxton that the notice of suspension of the premises licence due to no-payment of the annual fee would take effect as of 18 December 2017. On 18 December 2017, the annual fee was paid at the Licensing Office and therefore the suspension of the licence did not take effect.

On 10 January 2018 following a previous Licensing Act inspection of the Springfield Hotel carried out by Scott Lawrence Licensing Enforcement Officer and the Police when certain breaches of the Premises Licence had been recorded I carried out a follow-up visit to the premises along with PC Jason Arbuckle and at that time the person in charge of the premises was Mr Darren Hunter. Mr Hunter confirmed to Officers that there was no CCTV system currently installed at the premises as Police had removed the hard drive following a previous incident at the premises when Firearms Police were required to attend, and when Police returned the hard drive on 15/12/2017 it was returned damaged. Mr Hunter informed Officers that he had been advised by Cleveland Police that they would pay to replace the damaged system but he had heard nothing further since and not made further contact to Police regarding obtaining a replacement CCTV system. Officers also advised Mr Hunter regarding the use of a small stool, which was being used to hold the push bar for the fire escape in place at the rear of the premises, and the fire escape was also locked by bolts at the top and bottom of the door.

On 11 January 2018 PC Arbuckle confirmed to me that he had spoken with the Police Officer who had seized the CCTV system and the Officer confirmed that the system was returned to the Premises damaged, however Mr Hunter was advised by the Officer to purchase a new system and Cleveland Police would reimburse him for the cost of the new system.

On 17 January 2018 I carried out a further follow-up visit to the premises along with PC Arbuckle. At that time a new CCTV system had been installed which had a total of three cameras recording footage. Mr Hunter advised Officers that he would install more cameras to provide a greater coverage of the premises within two days.

On 19 January 2018 I carried out a further follow-up visit to the premises along with PC Arbuckle and at that time the CCTV system had seven cameras recording.

On 30 January 2018 an anonymous complaint regarding the operation and management of the Springfield Hotel was forwarded to the Licensing department from the Councils Environmental Health Service. I hereby exhibit said complaint marked NW2.

On 02 February 2018 a meeting was held at Middlesbrough Police Station with Miss Jaslyn Foxton. I was present at this meeting along with representatives from Cleveland Police and the Council's Environmental Health Service. Miss Foxton confirmed that in her role as DPS she

would normally attend the premises three times a week for approximately twenty minutes each time. She confirmed she had no other job other than being the premises Licence Holder & DPS

for the Springfield Hotel. Miss Foxton also claimed she had not been informed by Mr Hunter of previous Food Safety issues at the premises relating to a mouse infestation raised by Environmental Health officers. Miss Foxton was advised during the meeting that Officers would be inspecting the premises after 20/02/2018 and any further issues found during that inspection could lead to formal action being taken. Miss Foxton insisted she was 'going to kick arse' to ensure that the standards in the premises were improved. It was also highlighted to Miss Foxton that Mr Hunter had recently been aggressive and often used offensive language towards Council Officers and she was advised such behaviour would not be tolerated. Miss Foxton was also made aware of an anonymous complaint (Exhibit NW2) had been received alleging that people had been drinking alcohol in the premises throughout the night until the following morning and that the manager would regularly take Cocaine in the kitchen area. Miss Foxton again stated she had no knowledge as to whether either of the allegations were true.

At 01.25hrs on Sunday 25 February 2018, I was on duty on Borough Road with PC Mick Stage from Cleveland Road Policing Unit. I requested PC Stage to stop the Police vehicle we were travelling in opposite the Springfield Hotel on Borough Road following which I exited the Police vehicle and approached the Springfield Hotel. I could clearly see that the main doors were closed as were all interior blinds and I could not see any light nor could I hear any noise coming from the premises. I approached a window at the front of the premises and looked through a gap in the blinds through which I could clearly see that there were numerous people inside the premises drinking alcohol from cans and glasses. A male who appeared to be under the influence of alcohol approached me from the side of the premises and asked me what I was doing. I identified myself to the male and advised him that I was looking to see if the premises was still serving alcohol. The male continued to approach me and he stated 'there's nobody in there.' I pointed out to the male that I could clearly see through the gap in the blinds that there were numerous people still inside drinking alcohol. I moved to the side of the premises onto Laurel Street and as I did so a male who also appeared to be under the influence of alcohol exited the side door of the premises and walked to Borough Road where he got into a waiting taxi. I walked to the rear of the premises and could see inside the premises through a gap in the blinds that there were more people towards the rear of the premises who were consuming alcohol in glasses and cans and they were also smoking cigarettes.

I returned to the side of the premises where PC Stage and the unknown male were standing and I heard the unknown male confirm to PC Stage that he was 'a regular customer.' I looked into a window at the side of the premises and could clearly see through a gap in the blinds that there were approximately twenty people inside the premises who were drinking alcohol, smoking cigarettes and an elderly male was setting up the pool table ready to begin a game of pool. There were also containers on the tables filled with used cigarette butts. The unknown male advised me that all the people inside were residents who were staying at the premises and I asked him if the manager Darren was in the premises but he confirmed he was not. I remained outside the premises until 01.35hrs when people were still present at the premises, at which point I returned to the Police vehicle and we left the area. My observations particularly concerned me as at weekends the premises licence for the Springfield Hotel authorises the sale of alcohol until 1.00am, and also that the premises can remain open to the public to allow for drinking up time until no later than 1.30am.

At approximately 10:30am on Sunday 25 February 2018, I made a telephone call to PC Steven Craig from Cleveland Police Licensing Unit and advised him of what I had observed at the Springfield Hotel earlier that day. PC Craig contacted me later in the day and advised me that

he had spoken to the manager Darren Hunter and a male called Derek Hetherington who said they did not know that the premises had been operating outside of the licensable hours and they agreed to download CCTV footage to a memory stick to be collected the following day.

On 26 February 2018 I again visited the premises with PC Arbuckle and Mr Hunter was advised of the observations made on 25/02/2018. PC Arbuckle advised Mr Hunter that it was his intention to write to him and the DPS Miss Foxtan with a view to interviewing them both at the Police Station at a later date.

On 06 March 2018 I carried out a further follow-up visit to the premises along with PC Arbuckle and Mark Kearns Environmental Health officer. Officers were unable to carry out a Licensing Act inspection as Mr Hunter was not present due to illness and Miss Foxtan was also not present and did not answer her telephone when Officers attempted to contact her. The member of staff on duty identified herself as Marie Duffy, but during the visit she confirmed to Officers she had provided false details and was actually called Christine Morrison. Christine Morrison was unable to assist Officers due to her lack of knowledge regarding the conditions on the Premises Licence and therefore I could not carry out a Licensing Act inspection at that time. There were metal pots in the kitchen area containing cigarette butts and ash, cigarette butts and ash were also found in the cellar and bar area. The rear fire escape was again found to be bolted shut. The fire escape at the side of the premises was blocked by bar furniture and upon further inspection the outer fire escape door was padlocked shut.

On 09 March 2018, I carried out a further follow-up visit to the premises along with Police and the Fire service. Neither Mr Hunter or Miss Foxtan were present, and Christine Morrison was the person in charge of the premises at that time, but could not assist Officers with a Licensing Act inspection due to her lack of knowledge regarding the Licence. Officers again found the rear fire escape door to be bolted shut and upon unbolting the door Officers were still unable to open the fire escape. An unknown male then retrieved a key from behind the bar area and unlocked the fire escape door. The male advised Officers that the push bar on the door had been broken for some time and people had been accessing the premises by the escape to steal money from gaming machines. The fire escape at the side of the premises was blocked by bar furniture and the outer fire escape door was again padlocked shut.

On 14 March 2018 I carried out a further follow-up visit to the premises along with PC Arbuckle and Matty Stather from the Fire service. This followed an earlier visit to the Springfield Hotel carried out by Fire Officers on 10 March 2018, and I had been advised that fire safety issues had been recorded as a result of that visit. Mr Hunter was not available due to personal issues and Miss Foxtan was again not present and once more did not answer her phone when Officers attempted to contact her. Police Officers spoke to Mr Hunter on the telephone and he confirmed that Derek Hetherington would be attending the premises to meet us and Mr Hetherington arrived shortly afterwards. The fire escape at the side of the premises had all fire escape signage removed so was not being used as a fire escape at that time. The rear fire escape was bolted shut, advice was given by the Fire Service and Mr Hetherington confirmed the Fire Escape would be repaired the following day. There were no staff present during the visit who could assist Officers with a Licensing Act inspection. Officers left letters for Mr Hunter & Miss Foxtan and Mr Hetherington confirmed he would ensure both letters would be given to them.

On 28 March 2018, I carried out a further follow-up visit to the premises along with PC Arbuckle. The member of staff on duty was called Stuart, he confirmed that Jaslyn had not been to the Premises that day and Darren was unavailable due to being unwell. Derek Hetherington

attended the premises also but neither of them could operate the CCTV. The refusals register was being used and an incident book was on site but no incidents had been recorded since 31/07/2016. The rear fire escape was not bolted and appeared to be in working order.

On 19 April 2018 following the issues found at the Premises and the lack of compliance, both Jaslyn Foxton being the DPS and Licence Holder and Darren Hunter being the manager of the premises were separately interviewed under caution at the Police Station.

During her interview Miss Foxton confirmed she hired Mr Hunter to manage the premises on her behalf and she had not been made aware by Mr Hunter about the ongoing issues. Miss Foxton accepted she should have had a more active role in managing the premises on a day to day basis as she was rarely at the premises.

During his interview Mr Hunter confirmed that he hired Miss Foxton to be Licence Holder and DPS for the premises. He accepted that he was responsible for certain issues at the premises however as Miss Foxton was the Licence Holder and DPS the overall responsibility for the premises was hers. Mr Hunter was questioned about the fire escapes at the premises being repeatedly bolted shut and confirmed that the escapes were locked as intruders had been accessing the escape doors and stealing from the games machine located at the rear of the premises. I put it to Mr Hunter that by having the fire escapes locked it would indicate that he had been putting financial gain ahead of the safety of his customers at which point Mr Hunter jumped from his seat and became extremely annoyed and aggressive in his manner, so much so that I anticipated being assaulted by Mr Hunter at that time. Mr Hunter subsequently calmed down following being spoken to by PC Jason Arbuckle.

On 27 April 2018 an application to transfer the premises licence and vary the DPS for the Springfield Hotel, 113 Borough Road, Middlesbrough into the name of Mr Derek Hetherington was granted by the Licensing Authority.

On 14 May 2018 an anonymous letter was received at the Licensing Office. The content of this letter highlighted concerns relating to the management of the premises, opening beyond the licensable hours and selling alcohol to persons under 18 years of age. I hereby exhibit said letter marked NW3

On 11 December 2018 I contacted Mr Derek Hetherington and informed him that due to the Premises licence annual fee not being paid in November 2018 it was the Council's intention to suspend the licence for the Springfield Hotel on Monday 17<sup>th</sup> December 2018 if the annual fee had still not been paid. Mr Hetherington said he would send somebody to the Licensing Office on that day to pay the fee. I returned to the Licensing Office from my lunch break and observed Mr Hunter sitting in the reception area with a Licensing Officer. When Mr Hunter saw me he questioned as to why I had demanded the annual fee be paid on that day and threatened to revoke the Premises licence if it was not paid. I explained to Mr Hunter that I did not insist on the annual fee being paid that day and that I did not threaten to revoke the licence. Mr Hunter asked me why I had contacted Mr Hetherington that day about the potential suspension of the licence rather than at the end of the week. I explained to Mr Hunter that I wanted to ensure Mr Hetherington was given as much notice as possible about the outstanding payment to avoid the suspension of the Premises Licence. Following this conversation and after Mr Hunter had left the Licensing Office I was advised by the Licensing Officer dealing with Mr Hunter that Mr Hunter had insisted on recording his conversation on his mobile telephone. I hereby exhibit marked NW4 an email from the Licensing Officer who dealt with Mr Hunter on that day.

On 17 December 2018 Mr Darren Hunter was found guilty at Teesside Magistrates Court of failing to prevent persons from smoking in the Springfield Hotel. Mr Hunter did not attend the hearing due to being unwell however the matter was proved in his absence. The court fined Mr Hunter in the sum of £1,000.00 along with a Victim Surcharge of £100.00 and costs of £892.00.

Section 4.31 of the Licensing Act 2003 states the following:

"Every Premises Licence that authorises the sale of alcohol must specify a Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS). This will normally be the person who has been given day to day responsibility for running the premises by the Premises Licence holder."

It is of great concern to the Licensing Authority that by Mr Hunters own admission he has employed people to be the Premises Licence holder and DPS for this premise and on each occasion Officers have attended the premises they have invariably not been able to speak to the DPS and Mr Hunter has been the person in charge of the day to day running of the premises.

When carrying out their regulatory duties, on occasions the Council Officers are met with hostility from customers at licensed premises, however the level of aggression and hostility shown towards Officers by Mr Hunter during routine visits has led to Officers to require the presence of Police Officers to ensure their safety.

I fully support the review of the Premises Licence for the Springfield Hotel submitted by Cleveland Police. Due to the concerns of Officers from the Licensing authority and other agencies, it is the view of the Licensing Authority in its role as a Responsible Authority that consideration should be given to the revocation of the Premises licence for the purpose of promoting the licensing objectives for public safety, the prevention of crime and disorder and the protection of children from harm. It is also of great concern that Mr Darren Hunter has been continuously responsible for the day to day management of the premises for some time and appears to be acting as the premises supervisor, however due to his conduct, Mr Hunter is not a suitable person to be involved in the supervision or management of Licensed premises.

**Premises Licence – The Springfield Hotel, 113 Borough Road, Middlesbrough,**

The Council has received a complaint from a member of the public in relation to noise nuisance emanating from your premises.

On Saturday 16 August 2014 Officers carrying out routine licensing enforcement duties observed that the front external doors of your premises were open and as a result music could be heard at the roadside.

I must remind you that a condition of your Premises Licence requires that *'All external doors and windows shall be kept closed when regulated entertainment is being provided except in the event of an emergency'*.

Please note that by virtue of Section 136 (1) of the Licensing Act 2003 a person commits an offence if he/she carries on or attempts to carry on a licensable activity otherwise than in accordance with the licence conditions. This offence, upon conviction, can carry a fine of up to £20,000 and/or 6 months imprisonment.

I must warn you that the premises will be monitored and that failure to rectify these matters will leave me no alternative other than to consider issuing legal proceedings against you.

Should you have any further queries regarding this matter please do not hesitate to contact me.

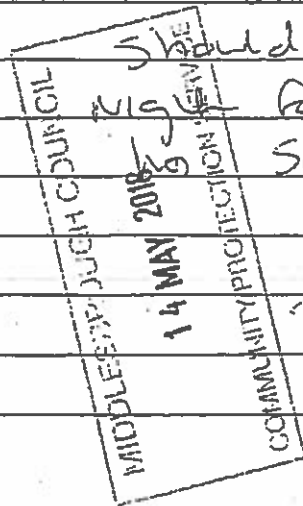

Darren Hunter came into the Licensing Office today to pay the annual fee for the Springfield. Mr Hunter sat down and demanded to speak to the person who called Mr Derek Hetherington to remind him to pay his annual fee. I said to Mr Hunter I will just check who called Mr Hetherington and went to the back office to find out. When I came back from the office I advised Mr Hunter that Neil Williams called Mr Hetherington. Mr Hunter asked to speak to Neil Williams, I advised Mr Hunter that Neil is not in the office at the moment. Mr Hunter then said 'before we begin I am going to record this conversation because this may be used his court'. Mr Hunter then said 'can you read this letter', I began to read the letter that Louise Romaine sent to Mr Hetherington regarding the non-payment of the annual fee at the premises. Before I could finish reading the letter to Mr Hunter, Neil Williams returned to the office and Mr Hunter signalled him over.

I am employed by Middlesbrough Council in the post of Licensing Enforcement Officer in the Licensing Section of the Supporting Communities.

I am authorised in writing to carry out duties on behalf of Middlesbrough Borough Council in respect of the Licensing Act 2003. I hold the BIIAB Level 2 National Certificate for Licensing Practitioners.

On 30 November 2017 at approximately 3.00pm I visited The Springfield Hotel, 113 Borough Road, Middlesbrough, to carry out a routine licensing inspection. At the time of the visit I spoke to Mr Darren Hunter, an employee at the premises where I found that the licence conditions relating to the retention of 31 days CCTV and the requirement to keep an incident book was not being complied with due to the hard drive being seized by Cleveland Police due a previous incident at the premises. In addition Mr Hunter was unable to produce for inspection Part A and Part B of the Premises Licence. I left Mr Hunter an inspection report detailing my findings and asked him to contact me within 7 days to confirm compliance. I hereby exhibit marker SL1 of said inspection report.

On 1 December 2017 I sent a warning letter to Ms Jaslyn Foxton, the Licence holder and Designated Premises Supervisor to her home address regarding the non-compliance of licence conditions at the premises and to contact me within seven days to confirm compliance. I hereby exhibit marker SL2 of said letter.

On 27 April 2018 an application was made to the Licensing Office to transfer and vary the Designated Premises Supervisor to Mr Derek Hetherington and the Premises Licence was issued on 14 May 2018.

On checking council records I can confirm that Mr Derek Hetherington is also currently the Premises Licence Holder of Junction Pub, Borough Road, Middlesbrough and has held this position since 10 March 2015.

During Mr Hetherington's reign as the Premises Licence holder at the Junction, there have been breaches of Licence conditions and poor management at the premises.

On 9 December 2016 I visited the premises with Cleveland Police to conduct a routine licensing inspection. Mr Hetherington was present and at this time I found the following breaches of licence conditions:

- No Leave Quietly Sign
- No advisory notices displayed in relation to sound levels at the premises
- Advice given in relation to the location of the key to the drug safe.

On 7 December 2017 The Premises Licence for the Junction was suspended for non-payment of the annual fee and was reinstated on 6 December 2017.

On 14 February 2018, following a complaint involving the management of the Junction Pub, I attended the premises with Cleveland Police and Environmental Health to conduct a licensing inspection. Mr Hetherington was not present and I found that the condition in relation to retention of 31 days CCTV not being complied with. Footage could only be shown for a period of 28 days.

On 9 November 2018 at approximately 7.55pm, I visited The Springfield Hotel, with PC Emma Price and PC Jason Arbuckle of Cleveland Police and Lee Haggath from Cleveland Fire Brigade, to carry out a licensing inspection at the premises.

Mr Derek Hetherington, the named Premises Licence and Designated Premises Supervisor was not present at the time of the inspection.

At the time of the visit I spoke to a male who identified himself as Darren Hunter who appeared to be responsible for the management of the premises that evening. I conducted an inspection and due to previous observations made by officers regarding alcohol being consumed in the outside areas after 11.30pm, I specifically advised Mr Hunter in relation to condition 12 of the crime and disorder objective on the operating schedule detailed on the premises licence 'No person should be allowed to consume any drink in any outside area after 11.30pm'. Mr Hunter acknowledged this and stated that he wasn't aware of this condition. I left Mr Hunter an inspection report detailing my findings. I hereby exhibit marker SL3 of said inspection report.

During the visit there were serious fire safety concerns identified at the premises and it was recommended that the premises should close until those concerns were rectified. During this time I observed a male who appeared to be intoxicated and unsteady on his feet. The male purchased a can of Stella Artois from the bar and took it to his living quarters upstairs. The male appeared dishevelled and vulnerable. After speaking to the male he identified himself as Joe and had lived at the premises for six months. Joe stated that he has an alcohol addiction and he is currently receiving treatment through an alcohol addiction programme. Whilst I stood in the doorway of his room, Joe attempted to smoke a cigarette in his room and I advised him not to, however he refused.

Due to my concerns with Joe, I approached Darren Hunter and informed him that it's an offence to sell to a person who is intoxicated and I advised him that the male shouldn't be able to purchase alcohol because of his alcohol addiction. Mr Hunter stated that he would rather sell him two cans of alcohol at the bar than allow him to purchase forty cans at an off licence and drink them in his room upstairs. I advised Mr Hunter that staff should be more vigilant in monitoring Joe and any other person who appears to be intoxicated.

Darren Hunter appeared very aggressive and hostile throughout the inspection on 9 November 2018. Mr Hunter stated to me that he hated Middlesbrough Council and had a particular dislike to Licensing Enforcement Officer Neil Williams.

On 13 November 2018 I contacted Mr Derek Hetherington, the Premises Licence Holder and Designated Premises Supervisor at the Premises to inform him of the concerns I have in relation to the inspection at the premises on 9 November 2018. Mr Hetherington confirmed that he had just returned from holiday and has been briefly updated on the situation. He stated that he intends to arrange a meeting with Darren Hunter to discuss the problems at the premises.

On further checks of council records, the Premises Licence for the Springfield Hotel was suspended on 7 December 2017 for non-payment of annual fee and was later reinstated on 18 December 2017.

On 11 December 2018, Licensing Officers again contacted Mr Hetherington to further remind him of the outstanding payment of the annual fee at the premises, which was due on 23 November 2018.

Based on my experiences when visiting the Springfield I have serious concerns regarding the management at the premises.

Section 4.31 of the guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 states the following: Every Premises Licence that authorises the sale of alcohol must specify a Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS). This will normally be the person who has been given day to day responsibility for running the premises by the Premises Licence holder. Section 4.32 of the above guidance further states that the Government considers it essential that police officers, fire officers or officers of the licensing authority can identify immediately the DPS so that any problems can be dealt with swiftly.

During my visits to the Springfield Hotel, Mr Derek Hetherington, the Licence Holder and Designated Premises Supervisor has not been present and it is my opinion that he doesn't have day to day responsibility for the management of the premises.

It also appears that although Mr Darren Hunter isn't named as the Designated Premises Supervisor, he is clearly responsible for management of the premises, however his conduct shows he is unsuitable for this role.



As the Responsible Authority for Public Health a representation is being made on the grounds of crime and disorder, public safety and protection of children from harm to support the application made by Cleveland Police in respect of The Springfield Hotel, 113 Borough Road, Middlesbrough.

Cleveland Police have presented evidence relating to the last 12 months which include a number of breaches of licensing conditions, carrying on licensable activity otherwise and in accordance with the premises licence, reports of violence, underage drinking and smoking inside the premises. There has also been a number of serious public safety concerns relating to fire safety as outlined within Police evidence.

The Premises Licence holder and Designated Premises Supervisor for the Springfield hotel is a male named Derek Hetherington. It appears from the evidence provided by Police that this male has no interest in this business or the premises and is not in day to day control which forms part of the role of Designated Premises Supervisor. The business is being operated by a male named Darren Hunter. This male was present and spoke to Officers during visits made at the premises. He has recently been found guilty by Teesside Magistrates Court for allowing people to smoke inside of these premises.

A number of visits made to the premises over the past 12 months by representatives of Cleveland Police, Cleveland Fire Brigade and Middlesbrough Council's Licensing and Environmental Health Officers have led to meetings being held with members of the management team due to the issues identified.

There are a number of concerns around whether this premises is being ran responsibly as there appears to be a total disregard for the law and for the licensing objectives which are there to ensure the safety of the public.

Attempts have been made to rectify such issues however there is a distinct lack of unwillingness by staff working at the premises to work with the Responsible Authorities in order to ensure that the law and the conditions of the Premises Licence are complied with.

These premises are situated in Central ward, a ward that has been declared saturated by Middlesbrough Council due to the number of licensed premises within this area, the high levels of alcohol related crime and anti-social behaviour and alcohol related health issues all of which impact on blue light services. It is paramount that licensed premises are ran responsibly and that the law and any conditions of a premises licence are complied with to ensure the safety of the public.

In this case there has been a total disregard for the law and for the conditions attached to the premises licence, both of which seriously undermine the licensing objectives and puts members of the public at risk.

This representation is made to support the review application made by Cleveland Police to ensure that this licensed premises is operated in such a manner which promotes the licensing objectives and does not present any further risks to the public.

Further evidence will be circulated in support of this representation prior to a Licensing Sub-Committee hearing.

Environmental Health Officers have visited the premises on numerous occasions and on each occasion have had concerns regarding contraventions of food hygiene legislation and smoke free law. Some of the issues that have caused concern regarding these premises include poor hygiene and repair standards, smoking being permitted within the premises and fire exits being bolted shut.

The attached statement submitted by Mark Kearns, Environmental Health Officer provides an account of observations made and necessary actions taken myself.

A chronology of the issues, expanded upon in detail within the Officers' statement, relating to these premises is listed below:

**30 November 2017,**

following a complaint from a member of the public regarding the cleanliness of the premises a food hygiene visit was carried out.

**12 December 2017**

- Intervention report was sent to Mr Hunter regarding the contraventions of Food Law and Smoke Free Law (see attached)

**2 February 2018** – A follow-up visit to the premises was carried out

- Similar standards of poor hygiene and structure were recorded again and further evidence of smoking was noted, discarded used cigarette ends and ash trays throughout.

**25 February 2018** – Officers from Licensing & Police visited the premises and witnessed people smoking in the premises.

**06 March 2018** – A further follow-up visit to the premises was carried out by Licensing, Police and Environmental Health.

- There was evidence of smoking had been taking place in the premises
- Side emergency exit was obstructed with chairs and other miscellaneous items, rear emergency exit was closed and locked from the inside.

**06 August 2018**

Mr Hunter attended Cleveland Police Station for a recorded interview under caution.

**17 December 2018** – Mr Hunter was found guilty of an offence at Teesside Magistrates Court. Namely, Being the person who controls or is concerned in the management of smoke-free premises, namely The Springfield Hotel, 113 Borough Road, Middlesbrough, did fail to comply with the duty to prevent a person there to stop smoking.

### **Summary**

Mr Darren Hunter the registered food business operator for the premises trading as The Springfield Hotel, 113 Borough Road.

Contraventions were noted at the initial inspection in November 2017 and required the attendance of a Licensing Officer and Cleveland Police Officers to ensure that the visit could be conducted without incident.

Following difficult conversations and aggressive behaviour from Mr Hunter and in accordance with the Public Protection personal safety risk assessment officers were instructed that any future visits were not to be made alone and to consult with Cleveland Police if necessary before attending.

Follow up visits to this premises showed little or no sign of improvement in the standard of cleanliness or repair and again, further evidence was gathered showing smoking inside the premises.

The Springfield Hotel currently has a Food Hygiene Rating of 2 (Improvement necessary). Confidence in management is a concern in this business as issues raised on the initial visit were not improved upon, attitude towards enforcement officers is often aggressive and intimidating.

I fully support the review of the Premises Licence for the Springfield Hotel submitted by Cleveland Police.

Due to ongoing contraventions of Food Hygiene law, Smoke Free law and concerns by Officers regarding the behaviour of Mr Hunter, consideration should be given to the revocation of the Premises licence for the purpose of promoting the licensing objectives for public safety and the prevention of crime and disorder.


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1. I am the above named person. I am employed by Middlesbrough Council as an Environmental Health Officer. I am authorised by Middlesbrough Council to enforce the provisions of the Health Act 2006 and the Food Safety and Hygiene (England) Regulations 2013 and related legislation
  
2. On 30 November 2017, I visited a premises trading as The Springfield Hotel, 113 Borough Road, Middlesbrough, TS1 3AX. The purpose of the visit was to conduct a food hygiene inspection. I was assisted by KATHLEEN FOREMAN, Environmental Health Officer.
  
3. The premises was operated by Mr DARREN HUNTER. The premises was located on the ground floor. It consisted of a bar area. To the left of this was a lounge. To the right of the bar was a function area with dance floor, DJ booth and pool table. Behind the bar was a kitchen.
  
4. Standards of hygiene were poor throughout, floors and surfaces were dirty and there was significant damage to the structure of the premises.
  
5. I went through the entrance door to the premises and into the kitchen. I noticed discarded cigarette ends on the floor. There was cigarette ash in the hand wash basin.

6. I explained that it appeared that there someone was smoking on the premises, MR HUNTER was on site at the time and I explained the offence of allowing people to smoke in a smoke free premises.
7. Mr Hunter had a dismissive attitude and was aggressive when confronted with evidence that customers had been smoking inside the premises.
8. It was noted that the fire alarm system had no power which raised concerns for the residents living above the ground floor.
9. Officers from Cleveland Police were called to assist and prevent an incident as Mr Hunter's behaviour was unpredictable and I felt intimidated.
10. Following this visit an intervention report was sent on 12/12/2017 explaining that evidence of smoking on the premises was gathered and that smoking on this premises was an offence (MK1).
11. Due to the poor levels of food hygiene at the premises it was necessary to conduct a revisit to check that significant progress to clean the premises had taken place, a revisit was undertaken on 02/02/2018 at which time further evidence of smoking was gathered.
12. Burnt ash was found the in the kitchen sink and other discarded cigarette ends were discovered on the floor throughout the bar and lounge area including empty packets of cigarettes behind seating and used cigarette ends in the male toilets sinks and urinals.
13. MR NEIL WILLIAMS, Licensing Enforcement Officer for Middlesbrough Council reported to me that during a routine late night licensing enforcement visit on 25 February 2018 that MR WILLIAMS and PC MICHAEL STAGE witnessed customers smoking inside the premises
14. I made a further visit to the premises on 06/03/2018 at which time I discovered a used ash tray in the kitchen area which contained burnt ash.

15. Walking through the bar area and the male toilets I found used and discarded cigarettes.

16. In the cellar and store area I found ash and used and discarded cigarette ends in the sink and on the floor area.

17. The rear emergency exit was closed and locked by a padlock during the visit, the premises was open for business at the time and customers were in the building.

18. The side entrance and emergency exit was obstructed as between the external double doors and the internal double doors was a large amount of wooden chairs and other items of furniture which would prevent quick exit in the event of a fire or other emergency.

19. On 06/08/2018, MR HUNTER attended the Cleveland Police Station for a recorded interview carried out in accordance with Code C of the Police and Criminal Evidence Act 1984.

20. MR HUNTER attended interview on 6 August 2018 and was asked questions surrounding the smoking offences including his role in managing the business, what he done to control people on the premises and how he ensured that the premises remained smoke free.

Significant statements include MR HUNTER stating that


- 'If I am not there, cats will play, I am responsible for those people, I can't be there 24 hours a day'


