3. Legislation

The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Licensing Authority to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the four licensing objectives:

The premises consist of a Public House located in Middlesbrough Town Centre trading with the benefit of a Justices On licence and Children's Certificate. These licences have been converted to a Premises Licence as part of this application.

5. The Representations

On 5 July 2005 a representation was received from Shelly Vickers, Planning Officer which objects to the application to vary the hours on the grounds of the prevention of public nuisance (see Appendix 2).

On 27 June 2005 a representation was received from Cleveland Police which objects to the application to increase the hours on the grounds of the prevention of crime and disorder (see Appendix 3).
