Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

Mandatory conditions in accordance with Section 19 of the Licensing Act 2003:

Where a premises licence authorises the supply of alcohol:

- (i) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- (ii) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

1. (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children -
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
 - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on -
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
 - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

4. (1) The premise licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

5. The responsible person shall ensure that -

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -

- (i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whiskey: 25ml or 35ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125ml; and

(b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Mandatory conditions in accordance with Section 21 of the Licensing Act 2003:

(1) Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, the licence must include a condition that each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

(2) But nothing in subsection (1) requires such a condition to be imposed -

(a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c.12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films), or

(b) in respect of premises in relation to -

(i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or

(ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).

For the purposes of this section -

(a) 'security activity' means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and

(b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

Condition requiring the admission of children to the exhibition of any film to be restricted in accordance with Section 20 of the Licensing Act 2003:

(1) Where the film classification body is specified in the licence, unless subsection (2) (b) applies, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that body.

(2) Where -

(a) the film classification body is not specified in the licence, or

(b) the relevant licensing authority has notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.

(3) In this section -

'children' means persons aged under 18; and 'film classification body' means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (c.39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification).

2. On New Years Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Years Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31 December).
3. In relation to the morning on which summer time begins, paragraph (1) of this condition shall have effect:
(a) with the substitution of references to three o'clock in the morning for references to two o'clock in the morning.
4. The licensed premises to be fitted with CCTV inside and out of the premises, to comply with the reasonable requests of the Police.
Digidiscs to be retained for 31 days or such longer periods as may be agreed with the Police and they must be kept in a locked cabinet.
5. To ensure the safety of the public, the permitted numbers within the premises will not exceed an overall number agreed from time to time with the Fire Brigade nor will the number stipulated by the Fire Brigade for each of the floors of the premises be exceeded, and a proper system of regulating the number on each floor will be adopted provided that the overall number shall not exceed 886 in any event.
6. One pint and a half pint capacity drinking glasses and highball (tumbler) drinking glasses, in which drinks are served shall be strengthened glass (tempered glassware) in a design whereby in the event of a breakage the glass will fragment and no sharp edges are left.
7. No under 18's to be allowed on the premises after 19.00 hours.

8. Customers shall not be allowed to enter or leave the licensed premises with any glassware except for the designated café area during the specified café area trading times, whether that customer enters on payment or not, to the best of the licensee's endeavours.

9. No alcohol to be taken by customers from the premise, except for the designated café area during its designated trading times.

10. To join and regularly attend Middlesbrough Pub Watch.

11. Subscribe to the 'radiolink' system once such a system is in operation and liaise with the Police Licensing Officer in relation to the same.

12. Temporary, removable guard railing for crowd control purposes to be supplied by the applicant for use by the Door Supervisors, subject to the consent of the local authority first being obtained where necessary.

13. Litter patrols, supplied by the applicant, shall be active within the vicinity at closing times.

PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT

1. Exemption from Standard Condition No. 31 - Consent to use a smoke generation machine subject to the following:

CLEVELAND COUNTY FIRE BRIGADE - STANDARD RECOMMENDATION FOR THE USE AND INSTALLATION OF SMOKE GENERATORS

The use of special effects involving the use of lasers, naked flame, smoke production or any other process creating a risk of fire shall not be allowed without the written consent of the Council.

Smoke Generators

1. Smoke generator is only to be used on the stage and smoke will only be produced in short bursts.
2. Only a minimal amount of cosmetic smoke is to be allowed and exits must always be maintained clear and visible.
3. A purpose built and approved smoke generator must be used.
4. Smoke generation must be in fixed position, adequately protected against interference by members of the public and manned by a competent operator.
5. The machine must be sited so that it does not cause hazard to surrounding risks, such as curtains or drapes.
6. The machine must not obstruct exit routes.
7. The machine must be sited and the volume of smoke controlled such that it does not affect the means of escape or obscure exit signs.
The amount of smoke in public areas should be limited to the minimum necessary for the desired effect. Actual operation of the smoke generator should be restricted, for example, to 2x5 second bursts in any one hour.
8. Fans should be used, where necessary, to direct the smoke/vapour into the desired area, in order to prevent clouding at the point of discharge and possible overspill into other parts of the premises.
9. The Licensee shall be required to produce documentary evidence of the non-toxicity, non-flammability, non-asphyxiant content of the smoke vapour produced.

NOTE:

Before the use of a smoke or vapour effect is approved consideration should be given to any automatic fire detection or fire sensor system installed in the premises.

PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT LICENCE CONDITIONS MADE BY THE MIDDLESBROUGH BOROUGH COUNCIL ("THE COUNCIL") BY RESOLUTION ON 18 NOVEMBER 1998 UNDER THE POWERS CONFERRED BY THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT (MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS) ACT, 1982.

Standard Conditions

The following Standard Conditions pertain to all premises licensed for Public Entertainment except those for Music and Singing (Automatic Gramophones).

1. That the Licensee will implement a drugs policy to the satisfaction of the Council and Cleveland Police in respect of the premises to be licensed.
2. The Licensee must ensure that there will be a secure drugs deposit box approved by Cleveland Police, on all liquor licensed premises which are also licensed for Public Entertainment beyond 11.00pm which will be used along with a hard bound Drugs Register, in accordance with the guidelines laid down by Cleveland Police.
3. The Licensee shall ensure that free potable drinking water is to be made available other than in sanitary facilities and such availability is prominently advertised to patrons.
4. The Licensee shall ensure that a minimum of one qualified first aider is present at all premises licensed for Public Entertainment beyond 11.00pm.

THE PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER

1. Every Thursday, Friday, Saturday the playing of darts and pool, snooker or billiards will cease at 8pm. All darts, cues and balls will from this time be stored in a secure place where the public do not have access.
2. Door supervisors to be employed on Friday and Saturday after 2100hrs (and after 2200hrs on Sunday to Thursday when the venue is to open later than 2300hrs) at a ratio of 2 door supervisors for the first 100 customers and 1 per 100 customers thereafter.
3. Training of staff by an external or internal training company shall be conducted on a 6 monthly basis, covering all four licensing objectives and, in particular, the avoidance of underage sales.
4. A personal licence holder to be on the premises at all times after 1800hrs when licensable activities are taking place.
5. When Middlesbrough FC play a category C home match (as advised by the Police), polycarbonate or other appropriate non-glass vessels will be used. Any drinks which would normally be served in glass bottles will be decanted at point of sale into polycarbonate or other appropriate non-glass vessels. On these match days, no glass will cross into the customer areas at any time.
6. In Surfers Bar (First Floor Bar) only polycarbonate or other appropriate non-glass vessels will be used. Any drinks which would normally be served in glass bottles will be decanted at point of sale.

7. In Walkabout Bar (Ground Floor Bar) from 2200hrs daily, only polycarbonate or other appropriate non-glass vessels will be used. Any drinks which would normally be served in glass bottles will be decanted at point of sale. Management in all instances will supervise the removal of glass vessels at above stipulated time.
8. The premises will use an approved ID system, to prevent underage persons being allowed access into the premises.
9. The capacity of the premises will be limited to 730.
10. Toilet attendants and glass collectors will carry radios at all times and report any disturbance or disorder within the premises to the manager or door supervisors immediately.
11. 'Challenge 25' policy is in use within the premises including appropriate signage around the venue.
12. The Premise Licence Holder shall not run any externally promoted student events from the Premises without prior approval from the Police.

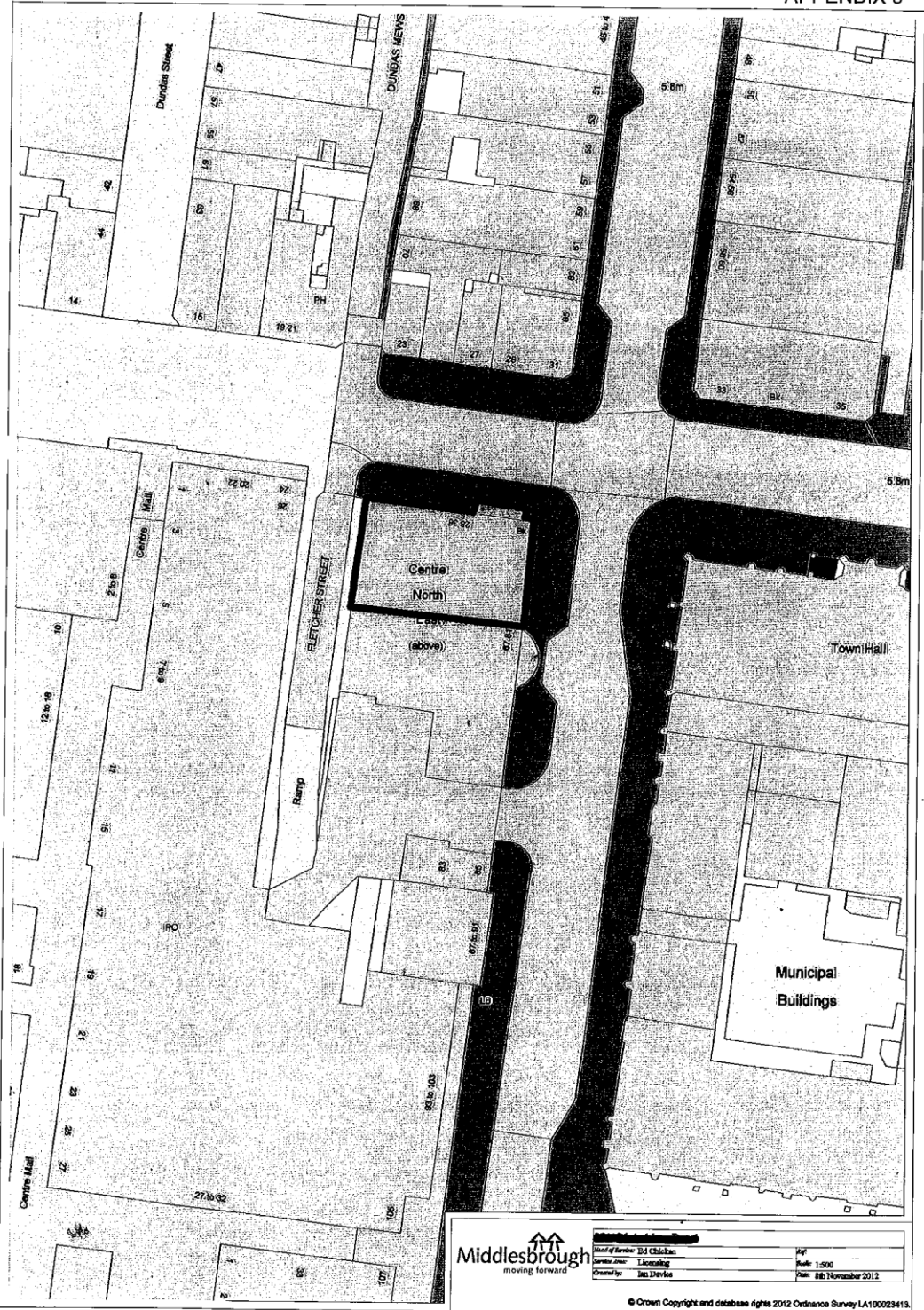
