3. Legislation

The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Licensing Authority to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the four licensing objectives:

4. Background

The premises consist of a ground floor convenience store located within a block of three retail units. There is residential accommodation above and other residential properties in close proximity to the premises. A location plan is attached at Appendix 2.

Council records show that on 11 January 2006 Members of the Licensing Committee granted an application for a Premises Licence for 1 Otterburn Gardens, Brookfield. This licence permitted the sale of alcohol off the premises between 8am and 11pm Monday to Saturday and 10am to 10.30pm Sundays and remained in force until it was surrendered by the previous holder on 14 February 2013 when the premises closed.

5. The Representations

On 1 July 2013 a representation was received from A Farrow, a local resident, objecting to the application on the grounds of the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance and the protection of children from harm. A copy of this representation is attached at Appendix 3.

On 9 July 2013 a representation was received from Cleveland Police objecting to the application on the grounds of the prevention of crime and disorder, the prevention of public nuisance and the protection of children from harm. On 16 July 2013 this representation was withdrawn following the applicant's agreement to amend his operating schedule to include a number of conditions. A copy of this agreement is attached at Appendix 4.

On 18 July 2013 documentation in support of the application was received from the Applicant. Copies of this correspondence are attached at Appendix 5.

Dear Sir,

With reference to: 1 Otterburn Gardens, Brookfield, Middlesbrough and an application for the sale of alcohol from Monday to Saturday 08:00 – 23:00 and Sundays 10:00 – 22:30.

I wish to register my objection to this application on the grounds of:

- 1. The prevention of crime and disorder
- 2. Public safety
- 3. The prevention of public nuisance
- 4. The protection of children from harm

The premises are situated between Hemlington and Acklam where many youths/children pass through the Brookfield estate, going to and from school. Quite a few openly consume alcohol both during the day and at night. Many of these youths congregate on the green area at Bluebell beck drinking and discarding the cans and bottles where they drink them. The result is broken bottles and discarded cans along the green area and to the side and rear of the shops on Otterburn Gardens at present, which would increase if this licence were granted. This creates a safety hazard for any person using these areas, particularly children playing along 'the beck' area. I am a dog owner and have on numerous occasions had to avoid certain areas along 'the beck' due to broken glass, split cans etc. I believe this anti-social behaviour is due to the large amounts of alcohol these young people are consuming.

The premises are situated in a residential area and I believe that anti-social behaviour will increase and this will have a detrimental effect on the lives of local residents. Litter problems would increase having an effect on the area and resulting in increased costs for the council to keep the area tidy. Noise levels would increase if this licence were granted for the late hours applied for as parking is situated directly opposite residential housing and residential housing is situated above the shops where I reside. The shop has security shutters which I can clarify does disturb residents late at night as I am situated above Otterburn Gardens which is currently open until 23.00 and disturbs me when closing this late. Customers using vehicles to visit the shop would create noise outside of the hours the shops are currently open, this I also experience as many cars and people hang around eating takeaways purchased. As alcohol and late night takeaways appear to go hand in hand along with the current fish and chip shop, when the middle premises open at 3 Otterburn Gardens which is planned to be another takeaway selling pizza, kebabs etc. this would escalate.

The premises I believe is to be called 'Brookfield Convenience Store' this would mean children would use the premises therefore exposing them to the sale of alcohol. They may attempt to purchase alcohol or ask adults to purchase it for them-a scenario I have personally encountered when the previous premises were open, having been harassed to purchase alcohol for

youths/children. This would cause a harassment nuisance to customers visiting the shop and increase the probability of young people being able to access under age alcohol consumption.

There are many off licences nearby, namely:

Tesco Blue Bell

Co-op Brookfield

Spar Trimdon Avenue

Spar Acklam Road

Booze Buster Acklam Road

Tesco Acklam Road

The area of Brookfield is a designated public place/ alcohol free zone due to the history of alcohol related problems over the years. The addition of another off licence would increase the likelihood of the zone being abused. Also who would police the area and any incidents arising, would there be additional resources for this?

Having lived in this flat for 22 years it can be no coincidence that the problems I have listed above I have encountered when any of the shops on this parade have been granted an alcohol licence. When the previous premises were open the shop was targeted by youths who would 'grab and run' with any alcohol they could get their hands on and /or threaten and abuse the staff to succeed in doing this. I have had people urinating and vomiting outside my property along with various displays of unsavoury behaviour due to the sale of alcohol at this parade and had to resort to involving Councillor John McPartland along with Cleveland Police to deal with the problems experienced. I strongly object to this application.

Further to your recent correspondence concerning the above. I confirm that I wish to amend my operating schedule to include the following:

- 1 A Challenge 21 policy will be implemented with all staff insisting on evidence of age from any person appearing to be under the age of 21 years of age and who is attempting to buy alcohol. There shall be notices at all points of sale and at all entrances and exits informing customers and reminding staff that the premises is operating a "Challenge 21" policy.
- 2 Staff will be fully trained and retrained on a six monthly basis and the training must include the laws relating to the sale of alcohol to under aged persons, persons buying on behalf of under 18s (proxy sales) persons appearing to be under the influence of alcohol and also the operation of the associated "Challenge 21" policy.
- 3 Training records must be signed by both the members of staff and the DPS/Store Manager/Business Owner will be retained for future reference and must be updated at least every six months. All training records must be made available to Police and/or a Responsible Authority upon request.
- 4 Only UK 'photo card style' driving licence, valid non-expired passport and PASS approved proof of age ID must be accepted as a form of identification at the premises.
- 5 A refusals book to be maintained and kept on the premises at all times and be made available to police and other responsible authorities upon request.
- 6 There must be a minimum of three signs in the premises stating that it is an offence to sell alcohol to persons under 18 years of age. The signs must be visible in the public areas of the store.
- 7 Digital colour CCTV must cover both internal and external areas of the premises. It must be recording at all times with footage being retained for a period of 31 days. There must

be a member of staff on duty who is trained in the use of CCTV and who is able to produce copied footage onto a disc which must be made available to reasonable requests by police and/or any other responsible authority.

- 8 An incident book must be maintained and kept on the premises at all times. It must be made available to police and any other responsible authority upon request.
- 9 No alcohol must be stocked within two metres of the entrance/exit door
- 10 No alcohol shall be consumed on the premises.
- 11 Groups of people will not be allowed to congregate outside of the premises

If my application is successful, I understand that these amendments will then form part of any conditions attached to the grant of the licence.

Although my son

takes me shopping once a week, I rely heavely on the shops over the road. I am a disabled pensioner and as I get old my memory is not what it used to be.
