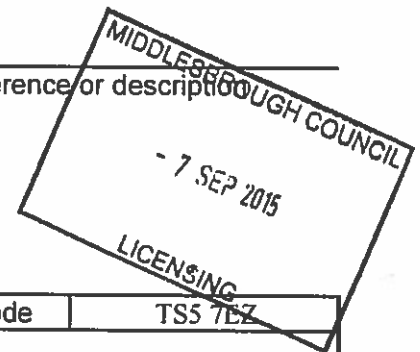

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

The supply of alcohol for off sales must be made at a time when the premises are open for the purpose of supplying alcohol, in accordance with the club premises certificate, to members of the club for consumption on the premises.

Any alcohol supplied for consumption off the premises must be in a sealed container.

Any supply of alcohol for consumption off the premises must be made to a member of the club in person.

Effective from 6 April 2010

1. (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children -

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

(d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on -

(i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or

(ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

(e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Effective from 1 October 2010

4. (1) The premise licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

5. The responsible person shall ensure that -

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -

(i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whiskey: 25ml or 35ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125ml; and

(b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Condition requiring the admission of children to the exhibition of any film to be restricted in accordance with Section 74 of the Licensing Act 2003:

(1) Where the film classification body is specified in the certificate, unless subsection (2) (b) applies, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that body.

(2) Where -

(a) the film classification body is not specified in the certificate,

or

(b) the relevant licensing authority has notified the club which holds the certificate that this subsection applies to the film in question, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.

(3) In this section -

'children' means persons aged under 18; and

'film classification body' means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (c.39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification).

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Club Operating Schedule

Embedded Restrictions

CLUBS

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours.

In this condition, permitted hours means:
11.00am to 11.00pm Monday to Sunday

On New Years Eve from the end of permitted hours to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31 December).

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- a) During the first 20 minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
- b) During the first 20 minutes after the above hours, the taking of alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- c) During the first 30 minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied as ancillary to the meals;
- d) The supply to, or consumption by, any person of alcohol in any premises where they are residing.

THE PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER

1. There is control over the number of patrons.
2. There is camera coverage of the car park.

4. Members are served in glasses which are toughened glass, (brewery

supplied). Members drinking outdoors are served in plastic glasses.
