3. Legislation

The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Licensing Authority to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the four licensing objectives:

- The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
- Public Safety
- The Prevention of Public Nuisance
- The Protection of Children from Harm

The Licensing Authority must also have regard to its Licensing Policy and any guidance issued by the Secretary of State.

4. Background

These premises are currently vacant and the applicant is proposing to operate them as a small convenience store offering a range of ambient and frozen foods and he has applied for a licence to be able to sell alcohol for consumption off the premises which would enable them to operate as an off licence as well.

Members are advised that these premises are located in Central Ward which has been identified as a Cumulative Impact Area in relation to Off Licensed Premises within the Council's Statement of Licensing policy. A location plan is attached at Appendix 2.

5. The Representations

On 21 October 2016, a representation was received from Councillor Linda Lewis and Councillor Zafar Uddin objecting to the application on the grounds that granting the application would undermine the four licensing objectives as the premises are located in a Cumulative Impact Area. (A copy of that representation is attached at Appendix 3).

On 8 November 2016, a representation enclosing a petition was received from Mr Tony Lamerton, Chairman of the University Ward Residents Association indicating that there has been an increase in anti-social behaviour in the area which relates to the sale of alcohol and the local community agrees that they do not need more premises selling alcohol as there is already more than enough premises to serve the local community. (A copy is attached at Appendix 4).

On 14 November 2016, a letter was received from Trading Standards indicating that following their concerns that the application failed to adequately address the licensing objectives "prevention of crime and disorder" and "protection of children from harm" the applicant had agreed to amend his operating schedule to include their suggested additional conditions and on that on this basis they had no objections to the application. (A copy is attached at Appendix 5).

- 2. To refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premise supervisor
- 3. To reject the application.

Members are reminded that any aggrieved party (i.e. Applicant, Responsible Authority/other persons who have made a representation) may appeal any decision of the Licensing Committee to the Magistrates Courts.
