Sale of Alcohol off Premises – 8am to 10pm Monday to Saturday 9am to 10pm Sunday

3. Legislation

The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Licensing Authority to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the four licensing objectives:

- The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
- Public Safety
- The Prevention of Public Nuisance
- The Protection of Children from Harm



The Licensing Authority must also have regard to its Licensing Policy and any guidance issued by the Secretary of State.

4. Background

The premises consist of a general food store located in a busy residential area. The premises previously traded with the benefit of a Premises Licence that permitted the supply of alcohol from 17 April 2008 up until 15 May 2015 when it was revoked by the Licensing Sub-Committee following a review hearing. The current applicant, Mr Kareem, was the premise licence holder and designated premise supervisor at the time of the revocation. A copy of minute 14/20 that refers is attached at Appendix 2. Members are advised that this minute also contains references to the review hearing in respect of 9 Parliament Road, Middlesbrough, as it was agreed at that time by all parties concerned that they would be heard together.

Members are advised that these premises are located in Newport Ward which has been identified as a Cumulative Impact Area in relation to Off Licensed Premises within the Council's Statement of Licensing policy. A location plan is attached at Appendix 3.

5. The Representations

On 16 November 2016 a representation was received from Councillor Lewis, Councillor Uddin and Councillor Storey objecting to the application on the grounds that the premises are located in a Cumulative Impact Area. A copy of that representation is attached at Appendix 4.

On 9 December 2016 a representation was received from the Director of Public Health on the grounds that the premises are located in a Cumulative Impact Area and that the application does not demonstrate how the premises will not negatively impact on the licensing objectives, in particular, prevention of crime and disorder, prevention of public nuisance and protection of children from harm. A copy of this representation is attached at Appendix 5.

On 13 December 2016 a representation was received from Cleveland Police on the grounds that granting the application will undermine the prevention of crime and disorder objective. Further evidence in support of this representation will be provided prior to the date of the committee hearing. A copy of this representation is attached at Appendix 6.

On 13 December 2016 a representation was received from Trading Standards objecting to the application on the grounds that granting the application would undermine the licensing objectives prevention of crime and disorder and protection of children from harm, as the applicant was the person in day to day control of the previous business who had their premise licence revoked, and as the premises are situated in a Cumulative Impact Area. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix 7.
