5. Local Plan Issues	PC gave a presentation explaining the need for a Local Plan review and the issues that are relevant to Middlesbrough Council residents.	
	The issues identified as part of the review are:	
	Housing (including Gypsy and Traveller) PC emphasised the importance of the HLP and the success in terms of housing completions in comparison to earlier years.	
	Cllr Rooney determined that social housing needs to be	

addressed at the early stages of the LP.	
Economic Growth PC advised on the economic activity rates/index of multiple deprivation and full time earnings by residence; and explained the need to identify what we need to focus on to increase economic employment growth.	
Cllrs were surprised by the low figures and Cllr Walker outlined concerns with data collection however PC explained that information is collected by Tees Valley Combined Authority and furthermore that figures have steadily improved throughout the Tees Valley, particularly Middlesbrough, in recent years.	PC to determine if TVCA can improve data analysis.
<u>Town Centre</u> As per the presentation PC suggests that improvements must be made to the environment and public realm of the town centre, focusing on other uses will potentially increase the demand for retail footfall in the long run.
