## COMMUNITY SAFETY and LEISURE SCRUTINY PANEL PROGRESS REPORT

## PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

1 To inform Members of the Overview and Scrutiny Board of the progress made to date by the Community Safety and Leisure Scrutiny Panel.

## RECOMMENDATION

2 It is recommended that the Overview and Scrutiny Board approves the actions of the Community Safety and Leisure Scrutiny Panel resulting from its meetings of $5^{\text {th }}$ April 2005.

## PROGRESS OF THE PANEL

3. The Community Safety and Leisure Scrutiny Panel held a meeting on the $5^{\text {th }}$ April 2005 when it engaged with Cleveland Police Superintendent of Operations. The Superintendent outlined the benefits derived from utilising the AIM process in tackling crime and areas of achievement to date. It was also conveyed to the panel the level of engagement and cohesion from the Police perspective with members of the Partnership who attend the weekly AIM meetings. The Superintendent informed the Panel this has demonstrated positive
benefits in the mobilisation of resources to combat crime in Middlesbrough.
4. The Panel is scheduled to meet again on Tuesday $26^{\text {th }}$ April to receive information regarding an independent review of the AIM process, which has been commissioned by the Authority. As the Panel meeting of the $26^{\text {th }}$ April will take place following the distribution of this progress report to the Board, I will therefore outline the key issues verbally at the meeting.
