Response – The main focus of the foster care preparation group training, which took place from 23/04/05-21/05/05, was the importance of carers advocating for Children Looked After, education being a recurrent theme throughout.</p> <p>The training programme for approved carers is to be revised in July 2005 to incorporate specific learning themes targetting the differing ages and needs of children.</p> <p>A one day multi-agency training event 'Parenting the Child in Public Care' has been organised to take place on 21/09/05.</p> <p>Ref: 04/03/10 (Target Date – 28/02/05) HAS BEEN IMPLEMENTED Working Group to be established to develop proposals that will assist the alleviation of bullying.
