PROGRESS OF THE PANEL

- 2. The panel has begun their review of Services to Carers in Middlesbrough by setting the terms of reference and receiving a 'Setting the Scene' presentation from the Head of Mental Health and Learning Disabilities.
- 3. The aim and terms of reference are as follows

To assess how the Council is helping to support carers in Middlesbrough.

The draft Terms of Reference are as follows:

- (a) To gain an understanding of the local picture and the issues facing carers in Middlesbrough.
- (b) To identify how many Carers Assessments are currently being undertaken and whether there is a need to increase the Council's performance in this area?
- (c) To gain an understanding of how the Council involves carers in the recruitment and training of staff and to establish the benefits of doing this?
- (d) To gain an understanding of the current range of support offered to carers in Middlesbrough.
- (e) To identify if that support is meeting carers' needs?
- (f) To identify the Council's responsibility to its employees who are carers and what are the implications of this responsibility for the Council?
- (g) To meet with carers' to discuss their experiences of the services they receive?
- 4. I have also presented the panel's final report on 'Developing Learning Disabilities' to the Executive, the report was received and the Service Response was approved.
