

# TRANSFORMING OUR LOCAL ENVIRONMENT

The Mayor's "Raising Hope" agenda highlights the need to improve the environment and reduce environmental impacts as key to making the town a more attractive place to live and invest.

The quality of life of Middlesbrough's residents and the quality of the public spaces in which our residents live and work is a crucial to the "transforming our local environment" theme. The Environmental Theme Action group of the local strategic partnership will develop and deliver strategies under "Transforming Our Local Environment" and lead on the Government's national liveability agenda designed to deliver "cleaner, safer, greener public spaces and improvement of the quality of the built environment in deprived areas and across the country, with measurable improvement by 2008." (PSA 8)

The Environmental Theme Action group has identified the following strategic priorities:

1. Improve the standard of cleanliness throughout the town, with a focus on key areas of the town
2. Develop a high quality network of public realm, open space and parks to serve the needs of the community
3. Contribute to the fear of crime in public spaces
4. Increase the amount of household waste, which is recycled
5. Improve air quality
6. Increase species and habitat biodiversity
7. Reduce the causes and adverse effects of climate change
8. Involve all section of the community in transforming the local environment

Through investment the town is already benefiting from a much cleaner, greener and safer environment. However in order to make real progress in making Middlesbrough a cleaner and greener town with high quality public spaces, good air quality, and an environment that support species and habitat biodiversity the Theme group has identified the following priority outcomes that it wishes to deliver through the local area agreement.
