This service is well used and expansion of this service to 5 days a week is being discussed.

Emotional Well-Being and Mental Health in Middlesbrough January 2009	17	1	2 <b>Ref: 09/07/01 (Target Date - 31/12/2009)</b> Dept of Social Care and Middlesbrough PCT to inform the panel of how they are planning to implement the emerging national policy, regarding more preventative services. <b>Response</b> - The outcomes of the independent research into the effectiveness and cost benefits of preventative services are not yet available. Middlesbrough Social Care Department have: 1. Agreed a way forward to sustain the Tees Valley Asian Welfare Forum 2 days per week. 2. Support the Milan Group for women from the BME communities who experience mental distress. 3. Continued to support the ILOP and Phoenix Services for Older People. 4. Reviewed the Mental Health Day Services to ensure availability of drop in services 7 days per week, in partnership with Middlesbrough & Stockton MIND. 5. Worked with TEWV NHS Trust to provide 7 day service for older people with Mental Health needs including an open access memory clinic. 6.
