



1. Outlined below is a summary of the weekly statistics, as issued to the Covid-19 Gold and Silver Command groups. The statistics presented are for the period week commencing 4 June 2020.

Weekly stats: 04/05 - 07/05	
Business grants	<p>01/05 - 06/05: 81 grants paid totalling £960k. To date: 1,824 grants paid totalling £21.4m. Phase 1, clean claims. Complete. Phase 2, queried claims. Ongoing with daily calls to revisit incorrect details on grant paperwork and identify non-eligible applicants. 39 remaining to process. Phase 3, outbound calls. Complete. Phase 4, letter drop to approx. 300+ businesses from week commencing 11/05 to those not yet claimed. Assumed 114 businesses will apply.</p> <p><i>To note: 135 business have been identified as meeting criteria, following government decision to provide additional support to businesses by extending grants application process, on a discretionary basis. Central Government guidance is expected week commencing 11/05.</i></p>
Community hardship grants	<p>73 crisis calls taken between 01/05 and 06/05; all dealt with within 24 hours either by payment or signposting (61 other / 12 COVID-19). To date, 61 (+1 in the above reporting period) crisis payments made in respect of COVID-19 causes of need totalling £4,198.</p>
Community Hub:	<p>123 calls received 01/05-06/05 (1,948 in total): 45 requests for prescription collections (444 in total) 76 requests for food (1,571 in total) 123 food parcels delivered (1,682 in total)</p>
Sickness / self-isolation:	<p>From 01/02/20 to date, 155 staff have been absent (+4 since 01/05 update), with COVID-19 symptoms / sickness (18% of staff absence in that period) and many have now returned to work. Today, 21 staff are absent with COVID-19 symptoms / sickness (15% of sickness absence today), down 3 from the position reported on 01/05. Self-isolation numbers are at 178, 17 less than last report on 01/05 (following late returns). <i>To note: Self-isolation numbers have recently levelled off and started to decrease. Silver Command are undertaking a review of 'self-isolation' reporting, as to whether the figure is a stable</i></p>

	<i>representation of vulnerable staff and whether this figure will reduce further whilst lockdown measures are still being imposed. An update is being brought back to Silver Command on 12/05.</i>
Middlesbrough COVID19 data:	At 419 , the rate of cumulative cases per 100,000 population in Middlesbrough is the 4th highest LA in England at present. With 589 cases in total, this is an increase of +1 from the position reported on 06/05.
Children at risk:	All SEND safety plans complete. 2,692 / 2,827 Total 415 / 419 CP 596 / 609 CLA 27 / 27 Dual 1,483 / 1,589 CIN 171 / 183 Leaving care 46 are in draft, 89 not yet started.
School attendance:	04/05: 306 (285 Primary, 15 Secondary, 6 Special) 05/05: 304 (266 Primary, 27 Secondary, 11 Special) 06/05: 326 (301 Primary, 16 Secondary, 9 Special) 07/05: 289 (255 Primary, 24 Secondary, 10 Special) Of total vulnerable children (2,905), the average weekly attendance is at 4.6% (+0.02% on 01/05 reported position). Of total children on school roll (24,636, which includes nursery and post-16), an average of 306 attended school between 04/05 – 07/05, which equates to 1.24% .

2. A detailed report on the Council's response to Covid-19 entitled 'Covid19 Response and Recovery Arrangements' is currently being developed, with a view to seeking approval via Executive. The report will include a financial summary (cost / loss of income / impact on savings), outline the wider Recovery Plan and its approach (followed by regular 3 / 6 month updates) and outline performance monitoring, as well as the model for engagement / involvement with OSB.
