Report Overview

The report sets out the PROCLAIM vision, mission and purpose and explains how the LA will support schools to become 'attachment aware and trauma-informed' (AATI).

Report Background

There is a wide body of research that demonstrates AATI schools provide many short and long-term benefits to children and adults, such as:

- Lower rates of exclusions
- Higher attendance

- Improved mental health and well-being for pupils and staff
- Improved rates of post 16 education, employment and training
- Reduced risks of criminalisation
- Reduced risks of substance reliance in later life

Some research even suggests that life span could be increased.

The PROCLAIM project aims to support all Middlesbrough schools to become AATI by 2025.
