#### OFFICER SCHEME OF DELEGATION - FULL DETAILS

The Elected Mayor and Council agree that all decisions set out in this Scheme are delegated to officers, unless one of the following exceptions apply:

Where the power is otherwise excluded from delegation by the Middlesbrough Council Scheme of Delegation or the Constitution;

Where key decisions are expressly delegated by the Elected Mayor or Executive to an Officer in an Executive decision (such delegations will be recorded in the Minutes of the meeting (and maintained by Democratic Services));

The Elected Mayor (or Executive) decides to make a decision delegated to officers under this Scheme (S.9E(7) of the 2000 Act);

The Elected Mayor (only) may agree individual delegations outside of this Scheme for reasons of urgency or otherwise protecting the Council's interests. Such delegations will recorded in writing and sent to the Monitoring Officer (or his / her delegate).

Where the Council decides to make a non-executive decision delegated to officers under this Scheme and / or decides to delegate the decision to a committee.

The Elected Mayor and Council authorises all Officers with delegated powers under this Scheme of Delegation power to delegate any or all of their powers to other Officers within their Service Area (or in the case of the Chief Executive, any Officer), save where prohibited by law. The Elected Mayor and Council have the right to withdraw or amend delegated where the Elected Mayor and / or Councils powers permanently or for a fixed period to one or more Service Area considers it appropriate to do so.

#### **Definitions**

There are some functions that the authority may treat as the responsibility of the Executive (in part or whole) or as Council (non-executive functions), at its discretion.

The following roles appear in this scheme:

- The Chief Executive shall be the Head of Paid Service and the Council's "Proper Officer" and shall, where permissible by law, discharge any functions delegated to another officer including all civic and ceremonial functions, and is referred to in this Constitution as "the Head of Paid Service";
- The Director of Finance shall be the Council's Section 151 Officer and Chief Finance Officer, and is referred to in the Constitution as "the Chief Finance Officer";
- The Director of Legal and Governance Services shall be the Monitoring Officer, and is authorised to sign or authorise other officers to sign all documents and agreements on behalf of the Council, is authorised to amend

the Senior Management Structure and associated job titles, and is referred to in this Constitution as "the **Monitoring Officer**"; and

 Collectively, the Head of Paid Service and Directors are referred to as the Leadership Management Team.
