Pride in Place – Impact funding

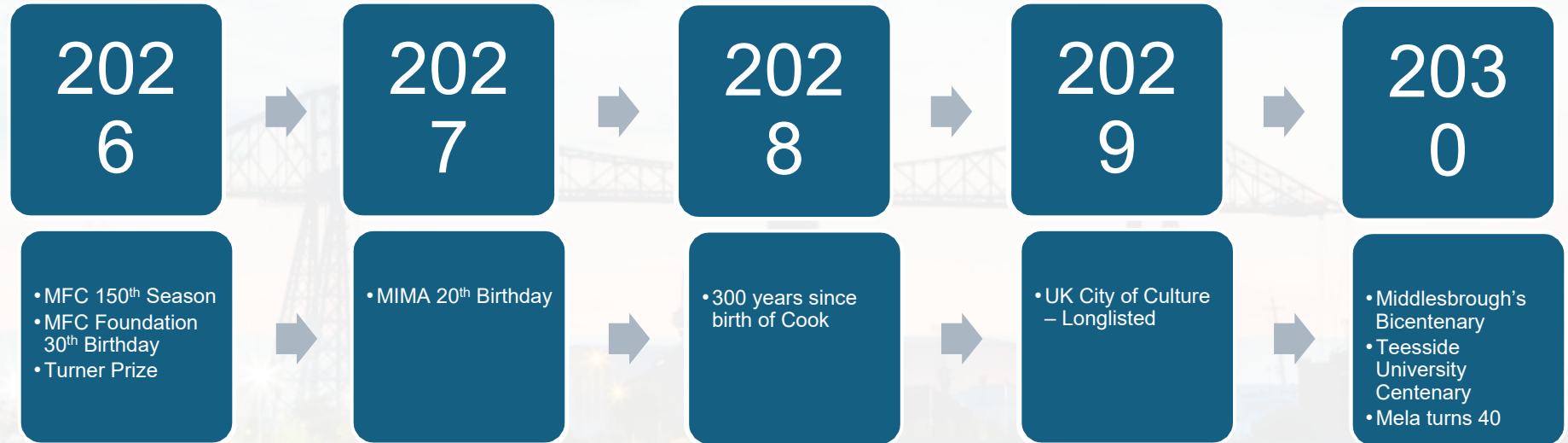
- Bring Wilkinson Lake back to life to retain as a town centre green asset

FSM Auto-enrollment	Average saving of £200 per child per year Over 500 Children enrolled in first year Over £700,000 in additional funding secured for schools
Welfare rights improvements	Over 1,700 cases in the first year Over £3,000,000 awards achieved for local residents
School meal price reduction	£70 per child saving a year for families attending schools with council catering compared to private sector providers.

Life-limiting illness support	New policy coming in the next few months to support around council tax and other major interventions to alleviate stress at an incredibly difficult time.
Lifetime enrichment	Expansion of the childhood enrichment agenda into future years to ensure we are supporting people through various stages of life
10x10	Currently finalising findings from the first stage of the pilot ready for further rollouts expected to run from June
IMD Fund	£150k targeting across 4 areas in the town. Early details to be released in June
