Does the Executive believe this is a potential problem, and if so what steps do they intend to take to safeguard the financial position of the town?

3/21	Councillor Hellaoui	The Mayor	 Children living in poverty in Middlesbrough According to a recent report published by Loughborough University it is very clear that significant numbers of children are living in poverty particularly in the North East Middlesbrough. In Middlesbrough L.A. 39.4% of children are living in poverty which means living in households where the income is less than 60% of the median income, once housing costs have been taken into account. These data refer to figures pre-pandemic when more people still had jobs. This report also compares the increased numbers of children in poverty between 2014/15 and 2019/2020. A particularly striking aspect of this, is a further large increase in child poverty in the North East. Overall where the child poverty rate has risen by over a third - from 26% to 37% - second highest region. Of the 20 local authorities with highest increase in child poverty rates, Middlesbrough is 5th from top with and increase of 10.3% when the average

increase in the UK is 2% of children living in poverty between 2014 and 2020.
Of all constituencies between 2014/15 to 2020, Middlesbrough has the highest increase 13.6% when again the UK average increase is 2%.
Here, in Middlesbrough, around four in ten children live in households in poverty after housing costs – yes, four out of ten!
I would like to ask:
1. What current action is taking place and which future policies are envisaged in Middlesbrough related to this issue and what can we do as a Council to monitor improvements?
